"Give me color book!" shouted the small boy in his native Khmer language.

He was just one of the hundreds of kids who live at the city dump in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. He wanted a book to read-andcolor book like all the other children had.

Charia Our and her husband Thearith had prepared 400+ Christmas bags for the people who live at the city dump. And in each bag they put bread, soap crayons and a Manna for Children book to color. Charia had translated the book and printed 500 copies at her own expense.

Since then, this young couple has been able to rent a building near the dump and turn it into a community center. The children come there for a snack and to learn about Jesus.



SMALL, LOW-COST BOOK

The small, low-cost coloring books we call "Manna for Children" are based on Bible stories. They are useful for teaching Bible truth, literacy-reading and to develop motor skills in these disadvantaged children in orphanages, hospitals, refugee camps where children have nothing.

The books are effective in class. The teacher can explain the story before the children begin to color the pictures. In Vacation Bible School, two pages can be colored each day.

To test comprehension, the child can be asked to explain the story or asked what a certain picture means.

Coloring the pictures helps impress the story on their memory so they cannot forget it.

HOW TO USE THE BOOKS

A pan of crayons can be placed in the center of a circle of children. Each child can take a crayon from the pan, use it and then put it back. The teacher puts the crayons away at the end of the period.



The books can be useful to summer teams going overseas. We are looking for North American and European churches which will sponsor the translation and printing of a book. With packs of crayons, these slim, economic books can be taken along by team members.

Whether you are home-schooling, work with kids' clubs in your church, or going on a short term missions trip to another country, it is very easy to download the PDF files for these books from the




