"Give me color book," shouted the small boy in his native Khmer language

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"Give me color book," shouted the small boy in his native Khmer language.

He was just one of the hundreds of kids who live at the city dump in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. And he wanted a Bible story book like all the other children had.

Charia Our and her husband Thearith had prepared 400 + Christmas bags for the people who live at the city dump. And in each bag they put bread, soap, crayons and a Manna for Children book to color. Charia had translated the books and printed 500 at her own expense.

Since then, this young couple has been able to rent a building near the dump and turn it into a community center. The children come there for a snack and to learn about Jesus. And they get Manna for Children books.



SMALL, LOW-COST BOOK

The small, low-cost Manna for Children books are based on Bible stories. They are useful for teaching Bible truth, literacy, reading and to develop motor skills in disadvantaged children in orphanages, hospitals, refugee camps, and houses for street children; places where children have nothing.



The books are effective in class. The teacher can explain the story before the children begin to color the pictures. In Vacation Bible School, two or three pages can be colored each day.

To test comprehension, the child can be asked to explain the story or asked what a certain picture means.

HOW TO USE THE BOOKS

We suggest a pan of crayons be placed in the center of a circle of children. Each child can take a crayon from the pan, use it and then put it back. The teacher puts the crayons away at the end of the period.

The books can be used by mission teams going overseas. We seek US churches which will sponsor translation and printing of a book and provide crayons to be carried to the ministry site by team members.
