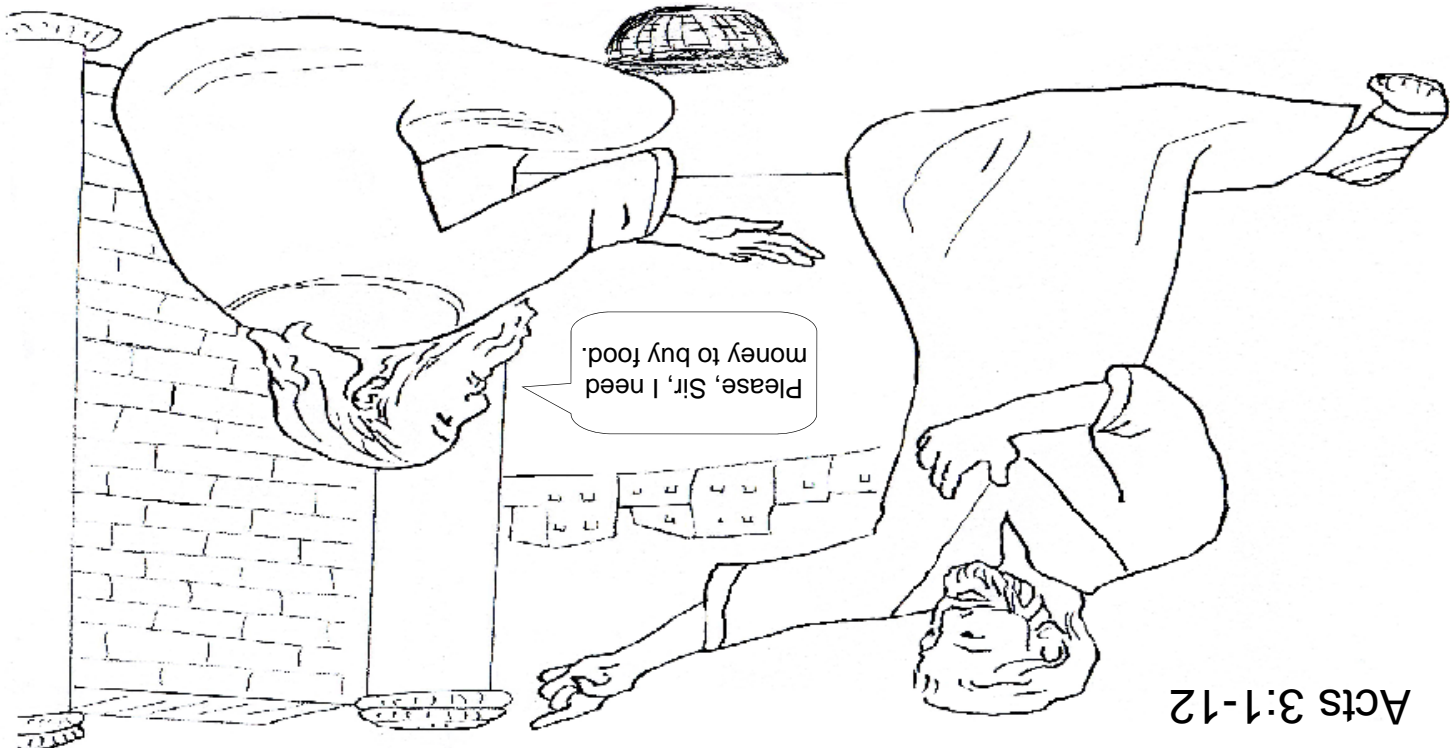

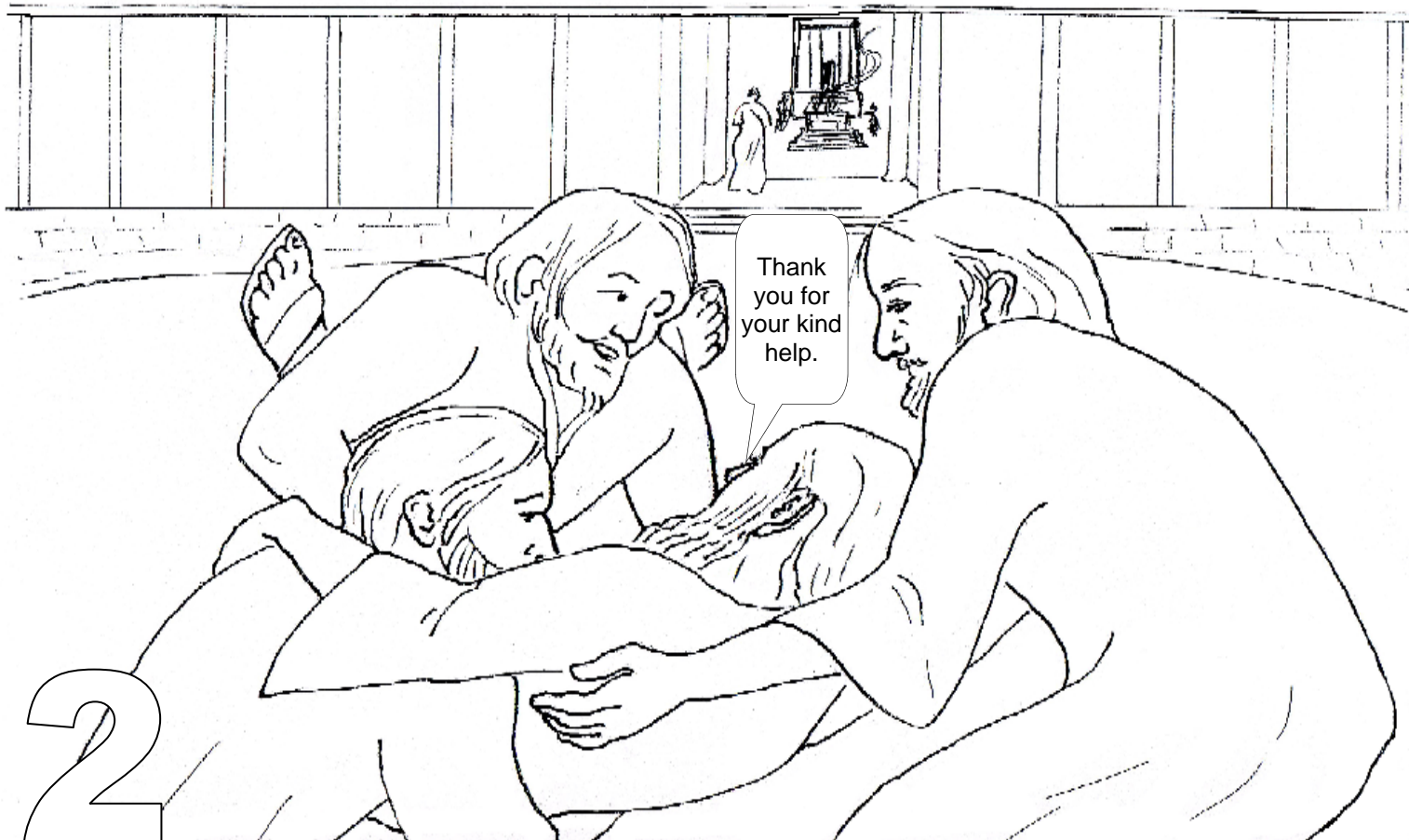

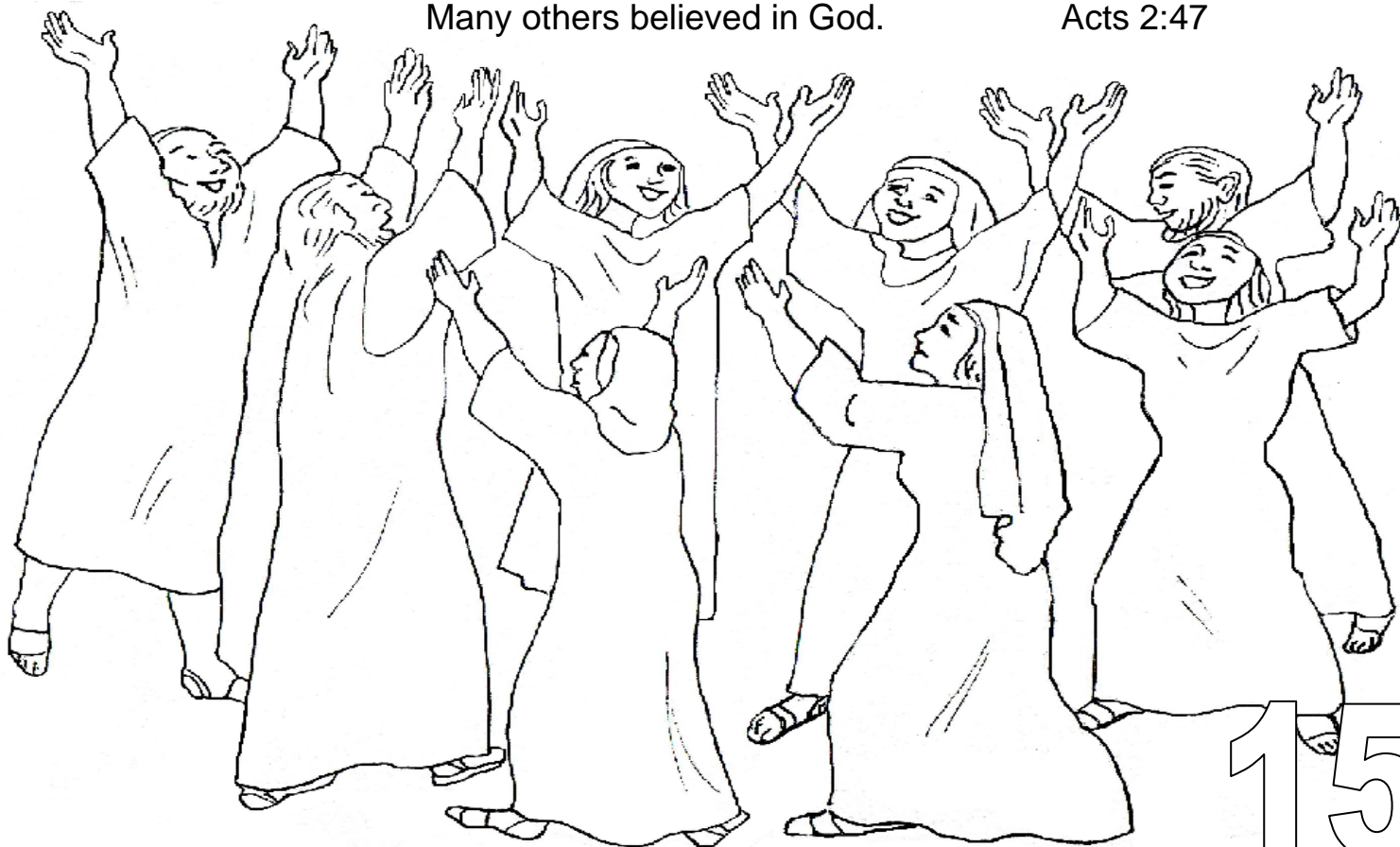


Every morning the crippled man's friends took him to beg at the Temple gate.



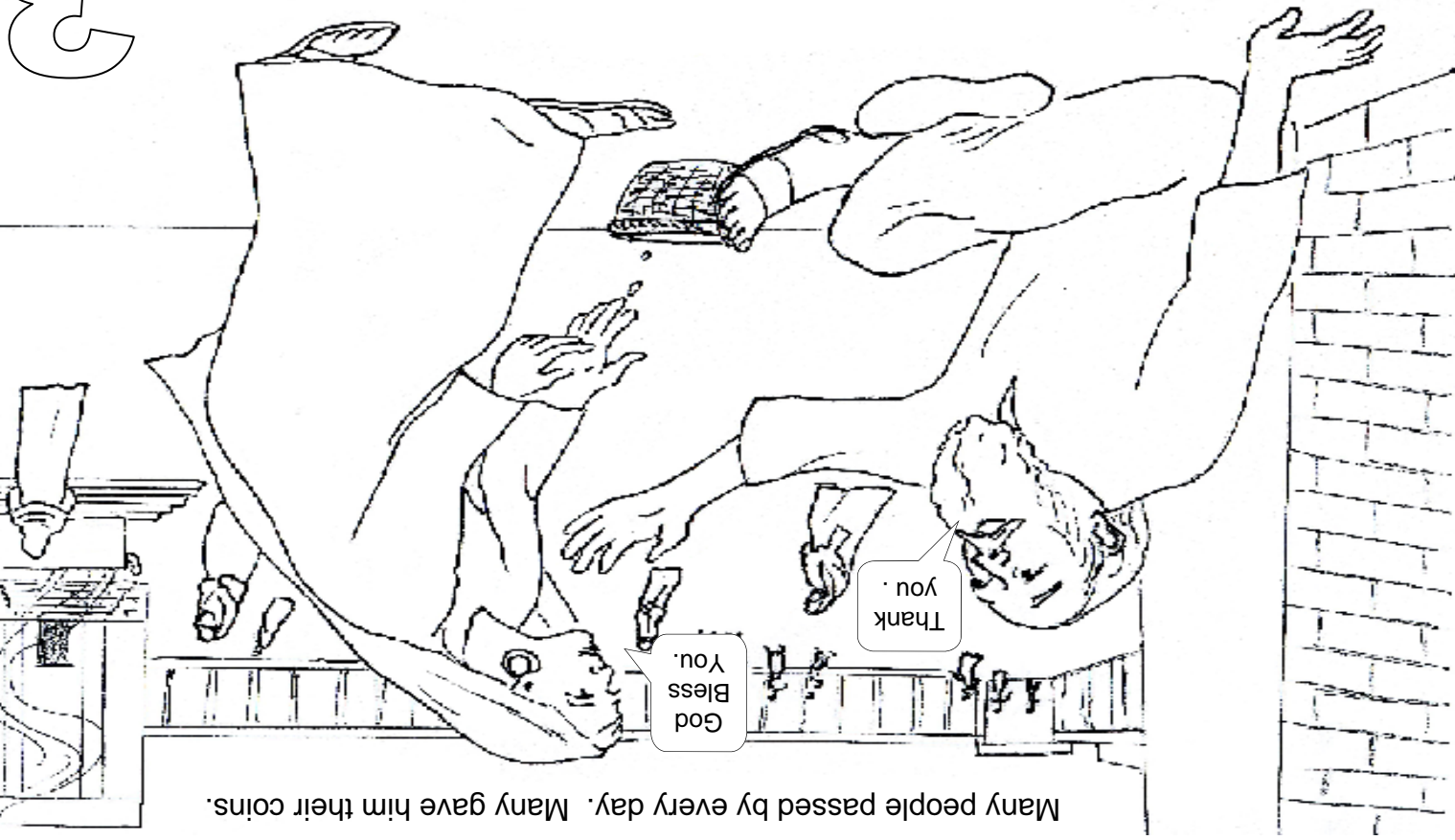
Christians knew the joy of serving Jesus. They saw many miracles.

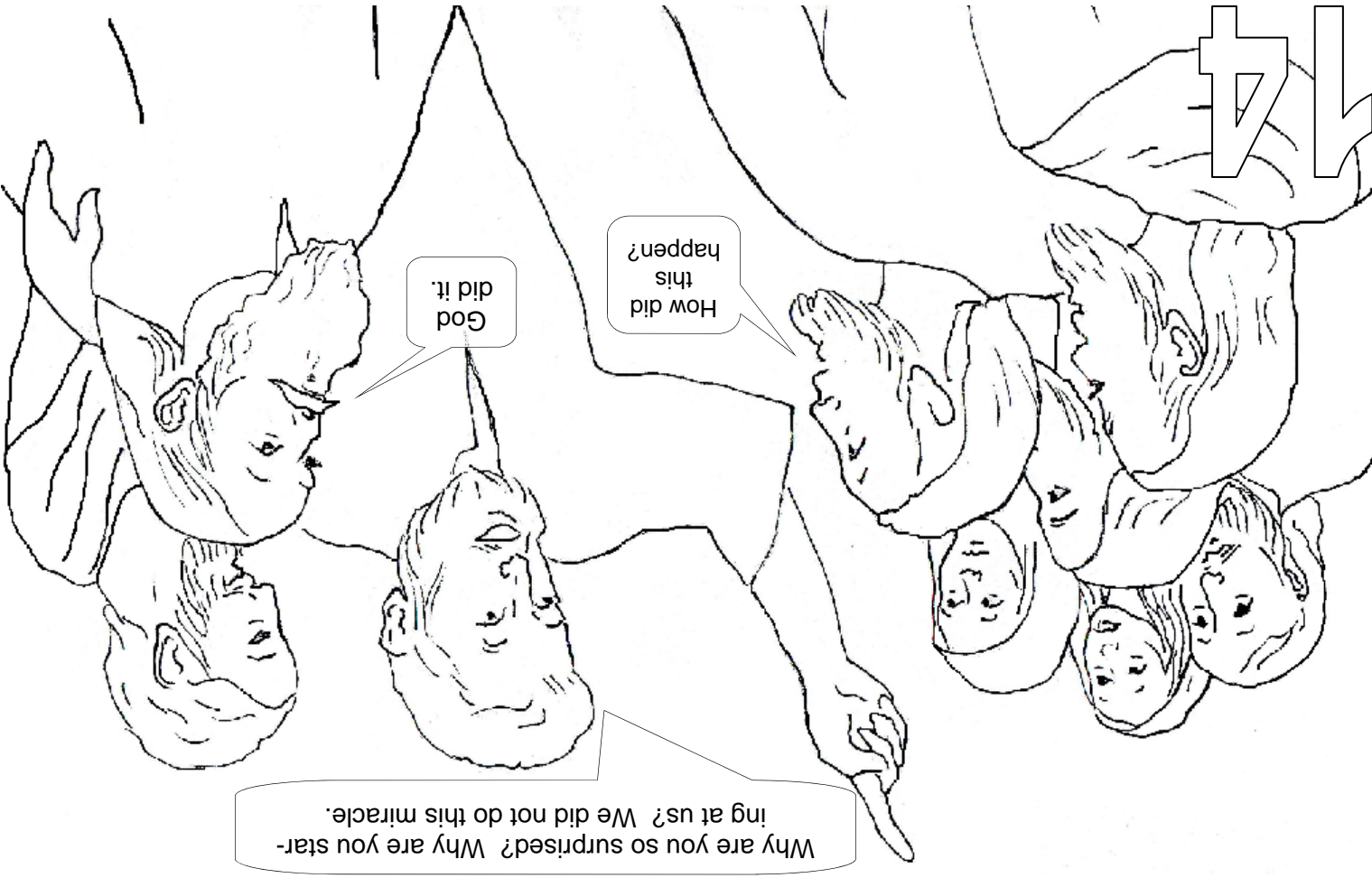




Jesus said, "As much as you have done it unto the least of these ... you have done it unto ME." Matthew 25:35



Many people passed by every day. Many gave him their coins.

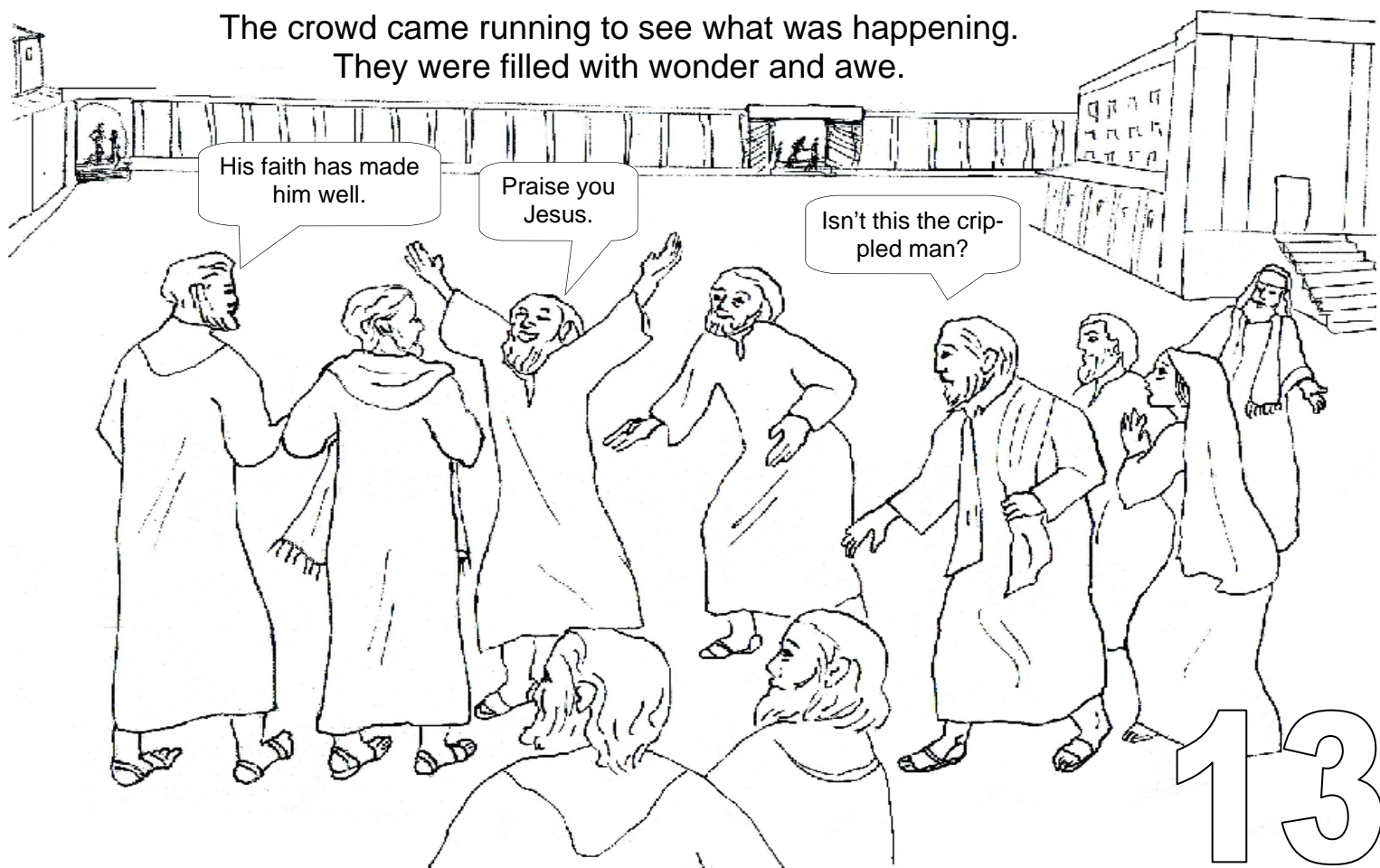




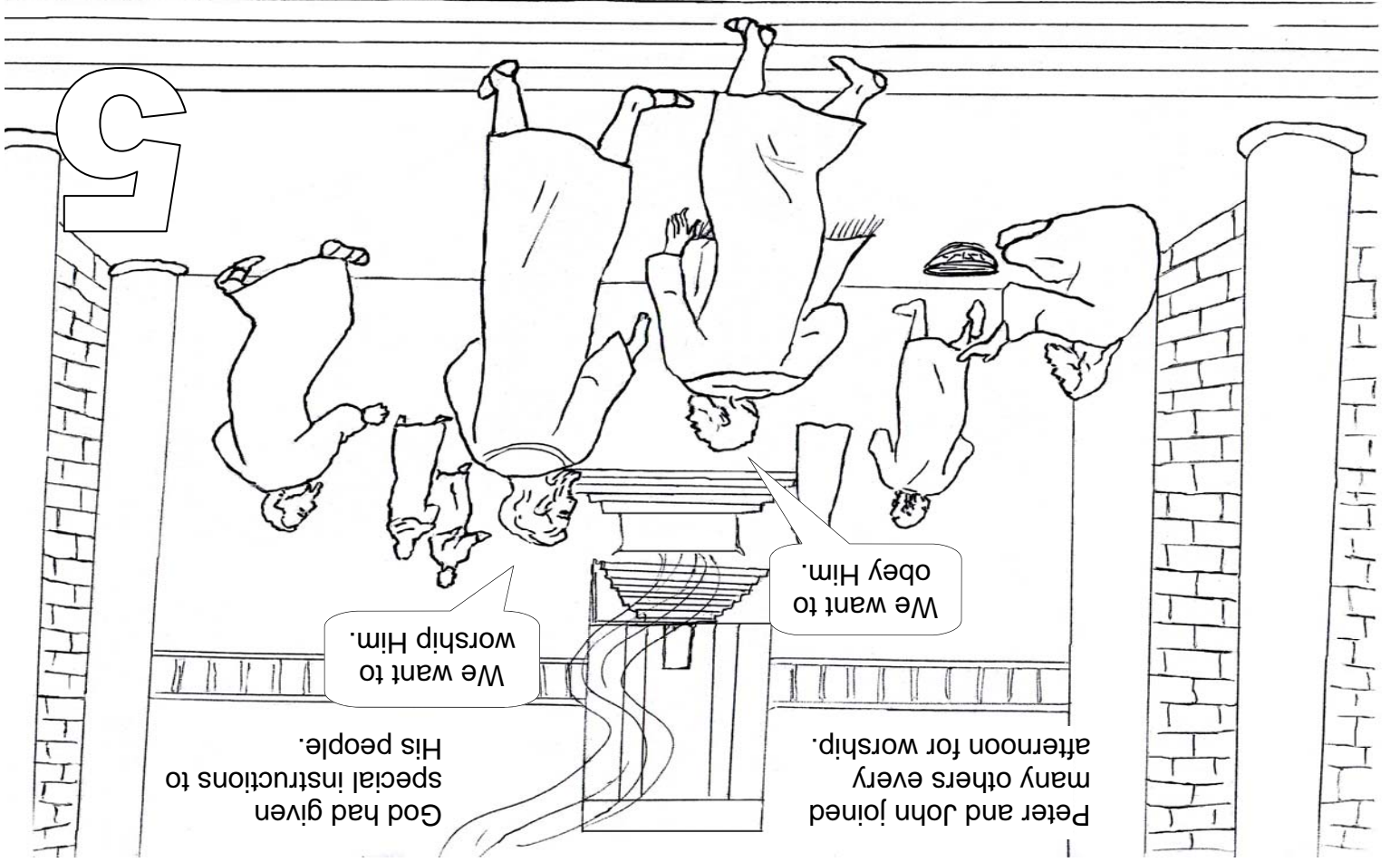
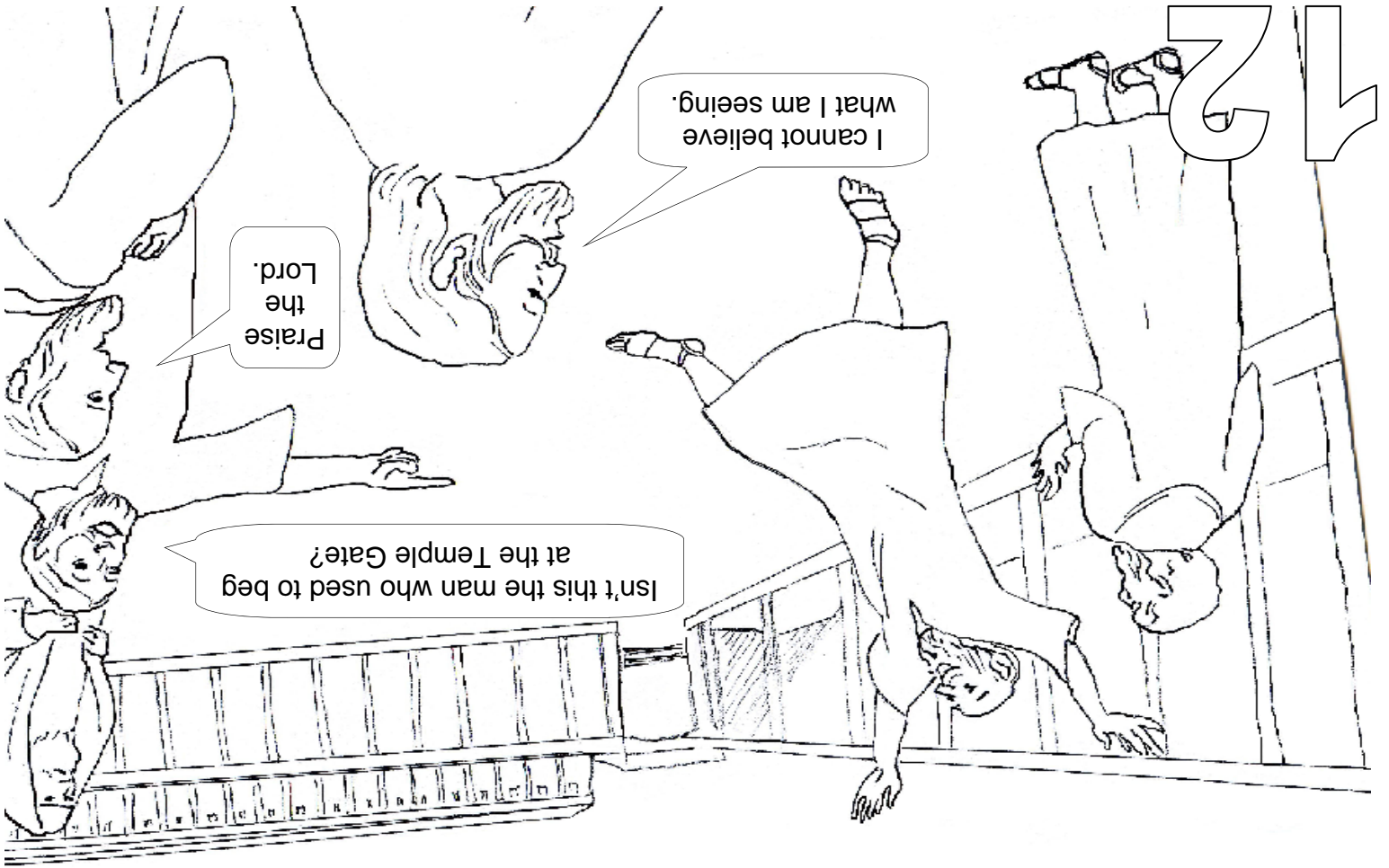
It was time for the evening prayer. Peter and John were on their way up to the temple in Jerusalem to pray.

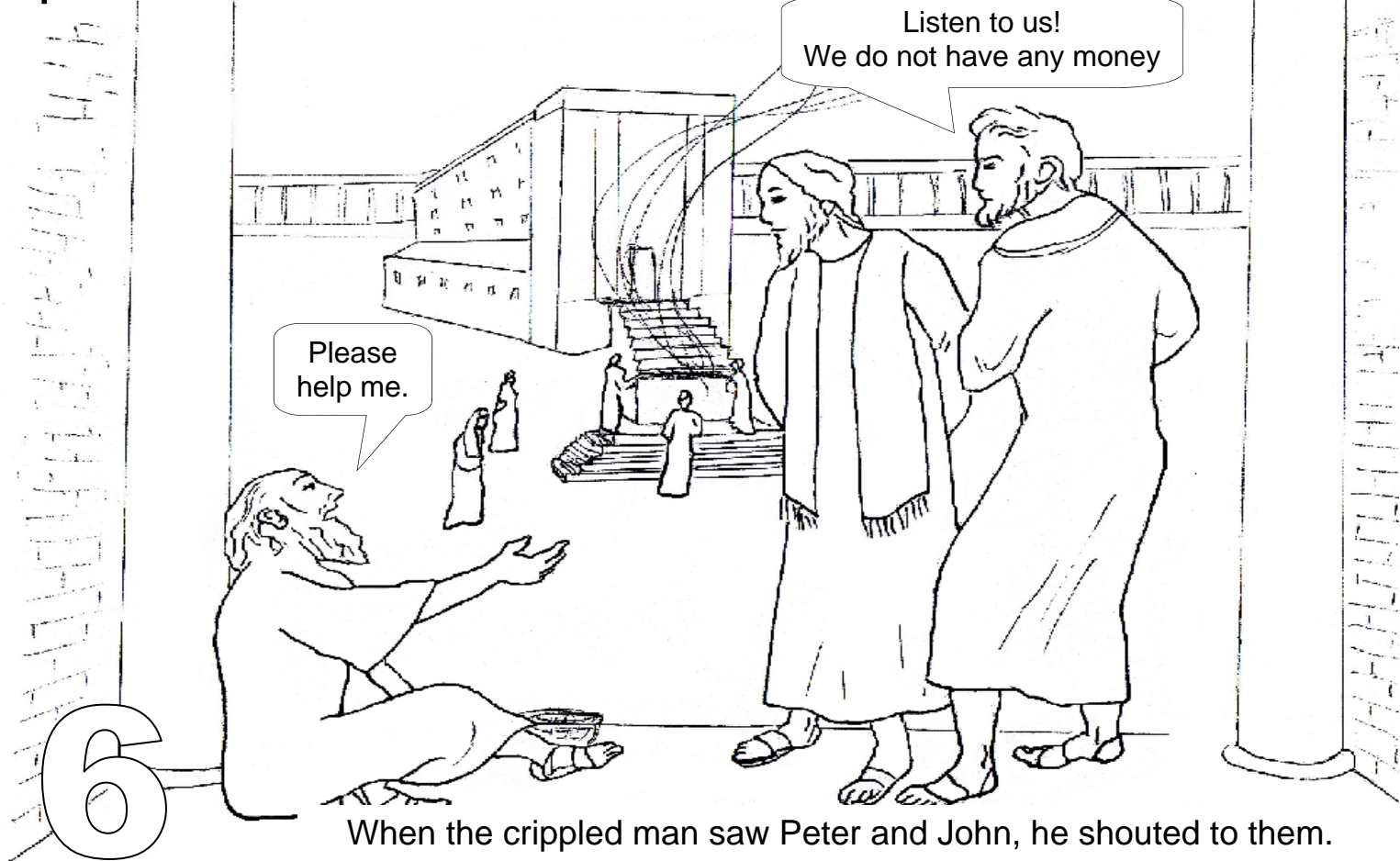


The crowd came running to see what was happening. They were filled with wonder and awe.





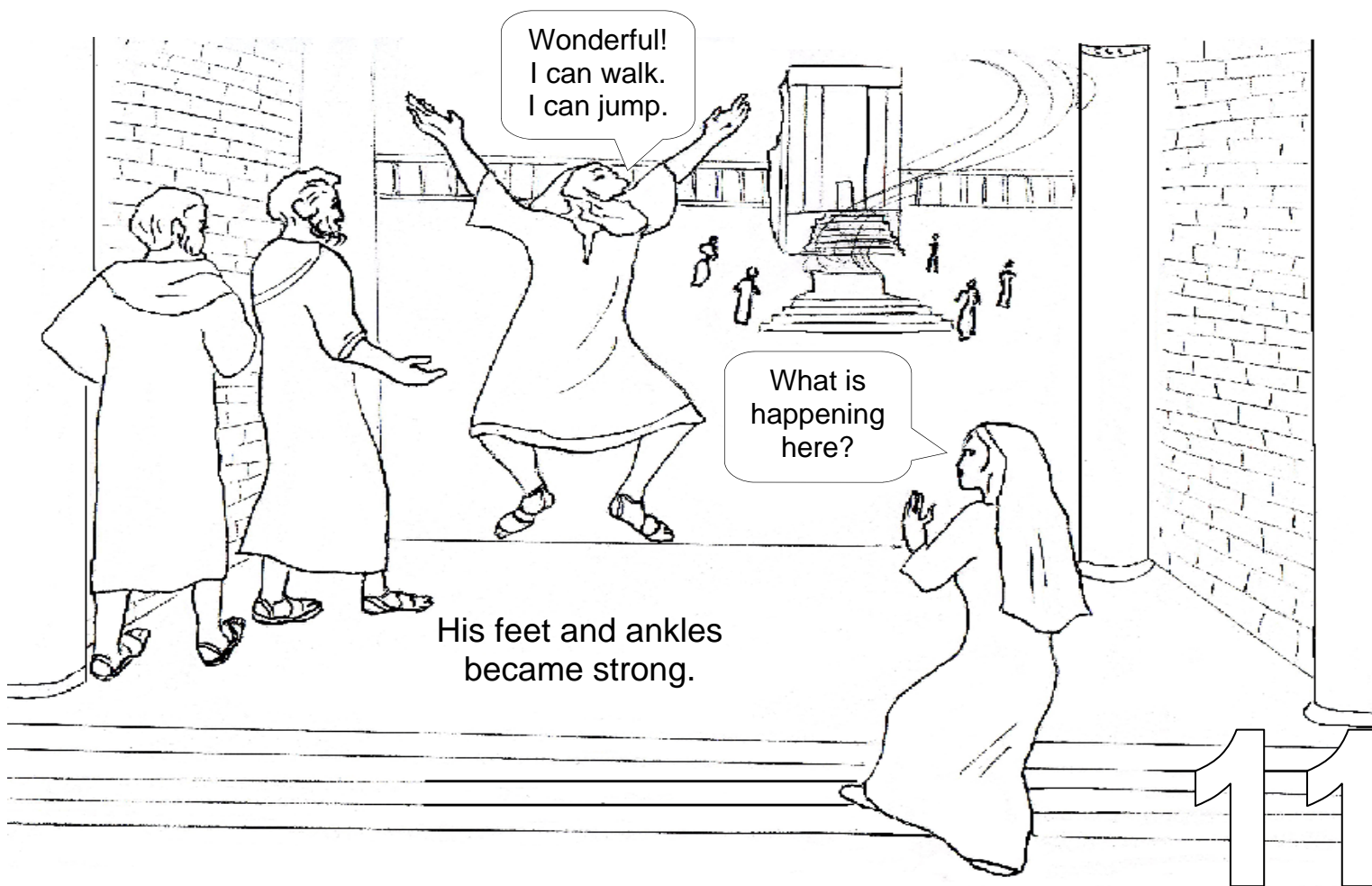




Please help me.

Peter took him by the hand and helped him get up. Acts 3:7

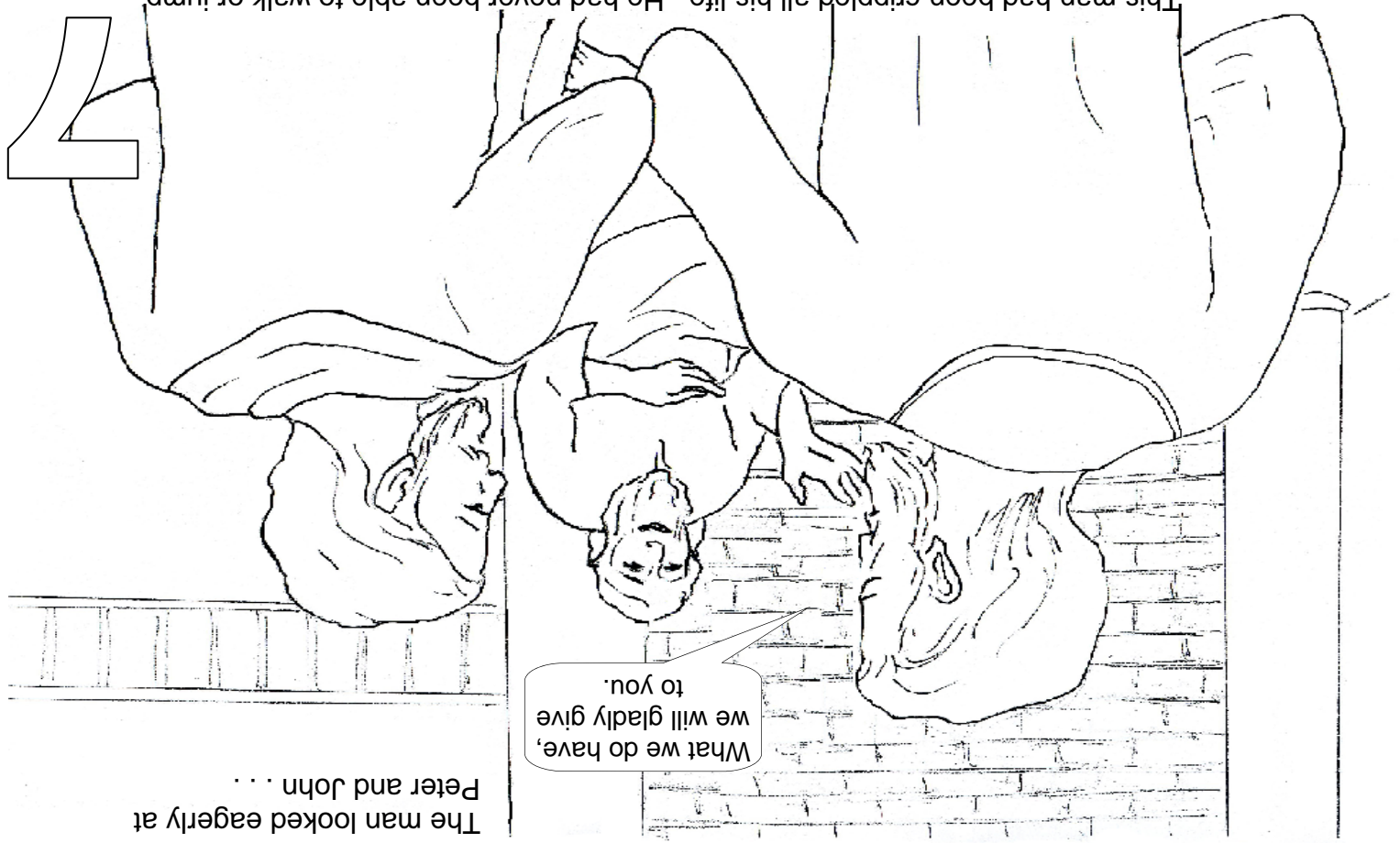

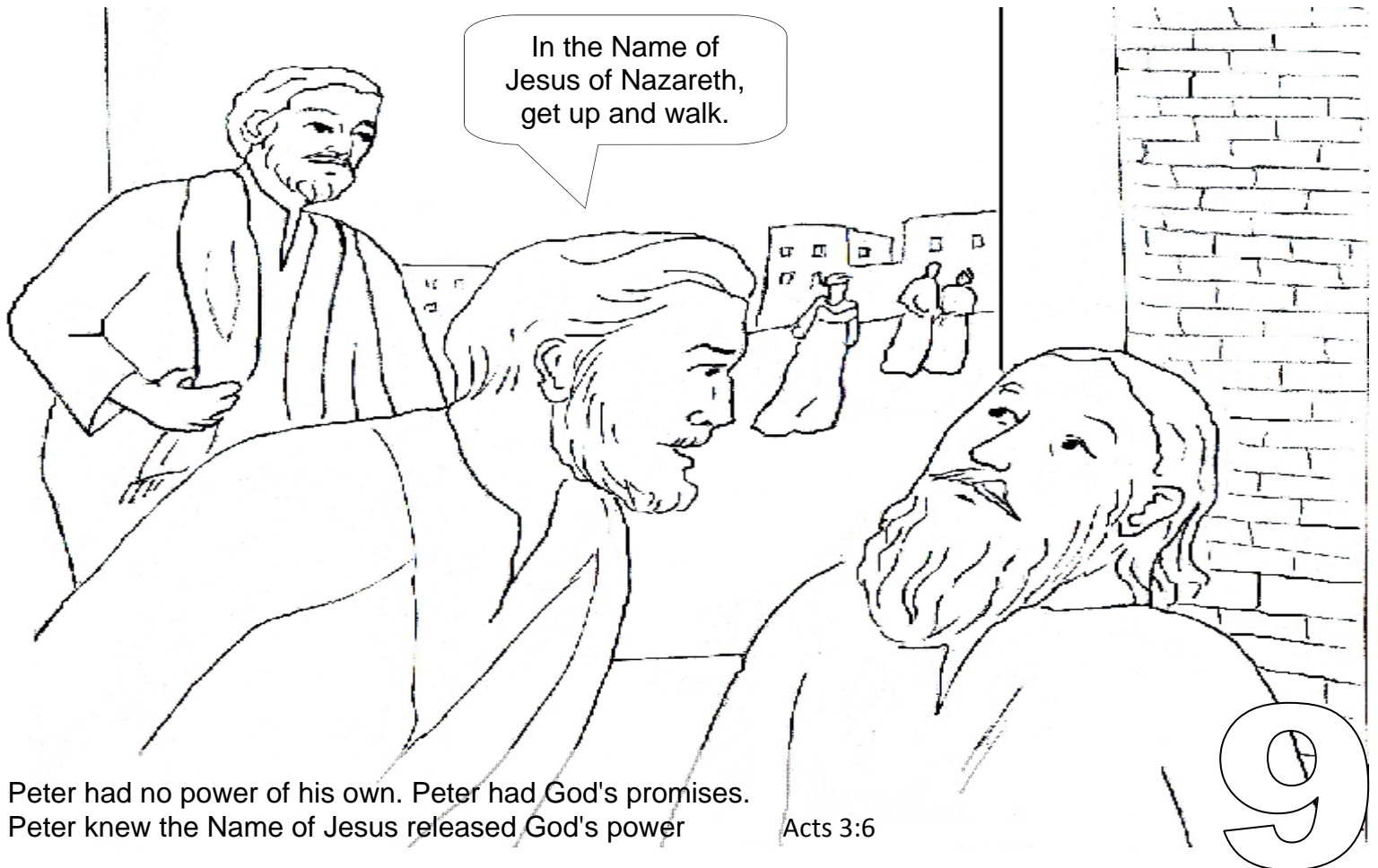
This man had been crippled all his life. He had never been able to walk or jump.
