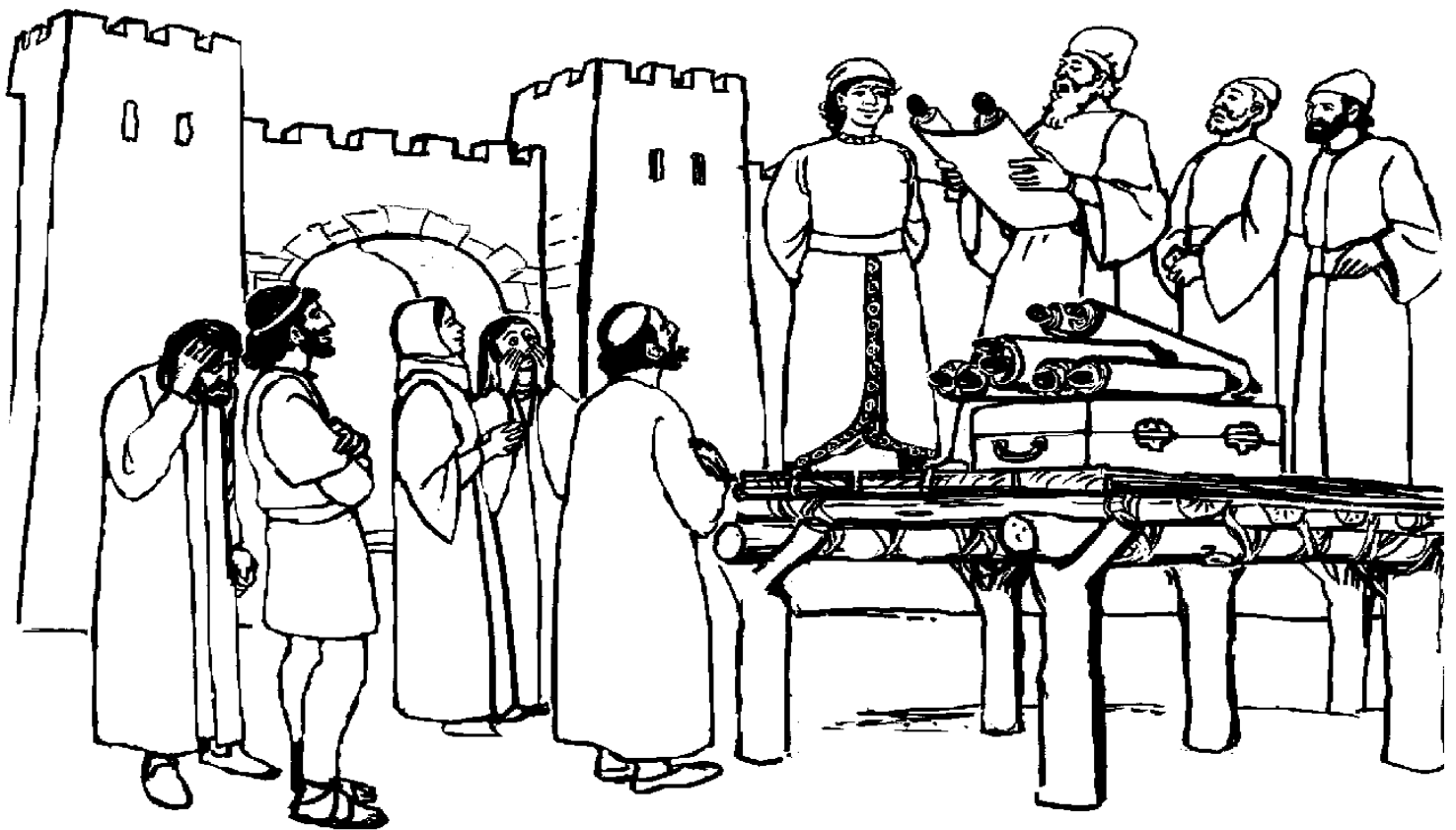
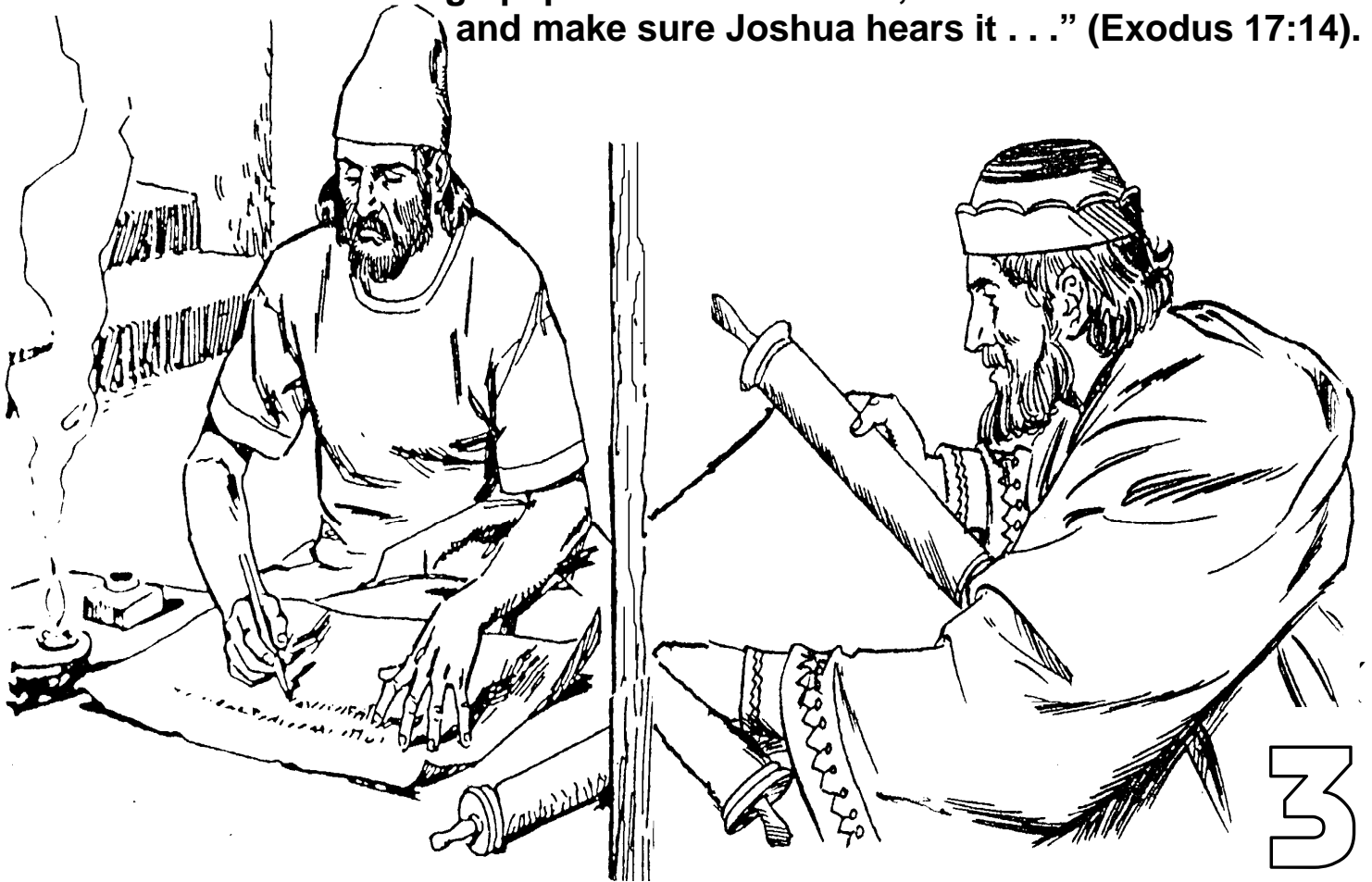
Exodus 1:11-14



God wrote the greatest book in the world and we must study it with care.

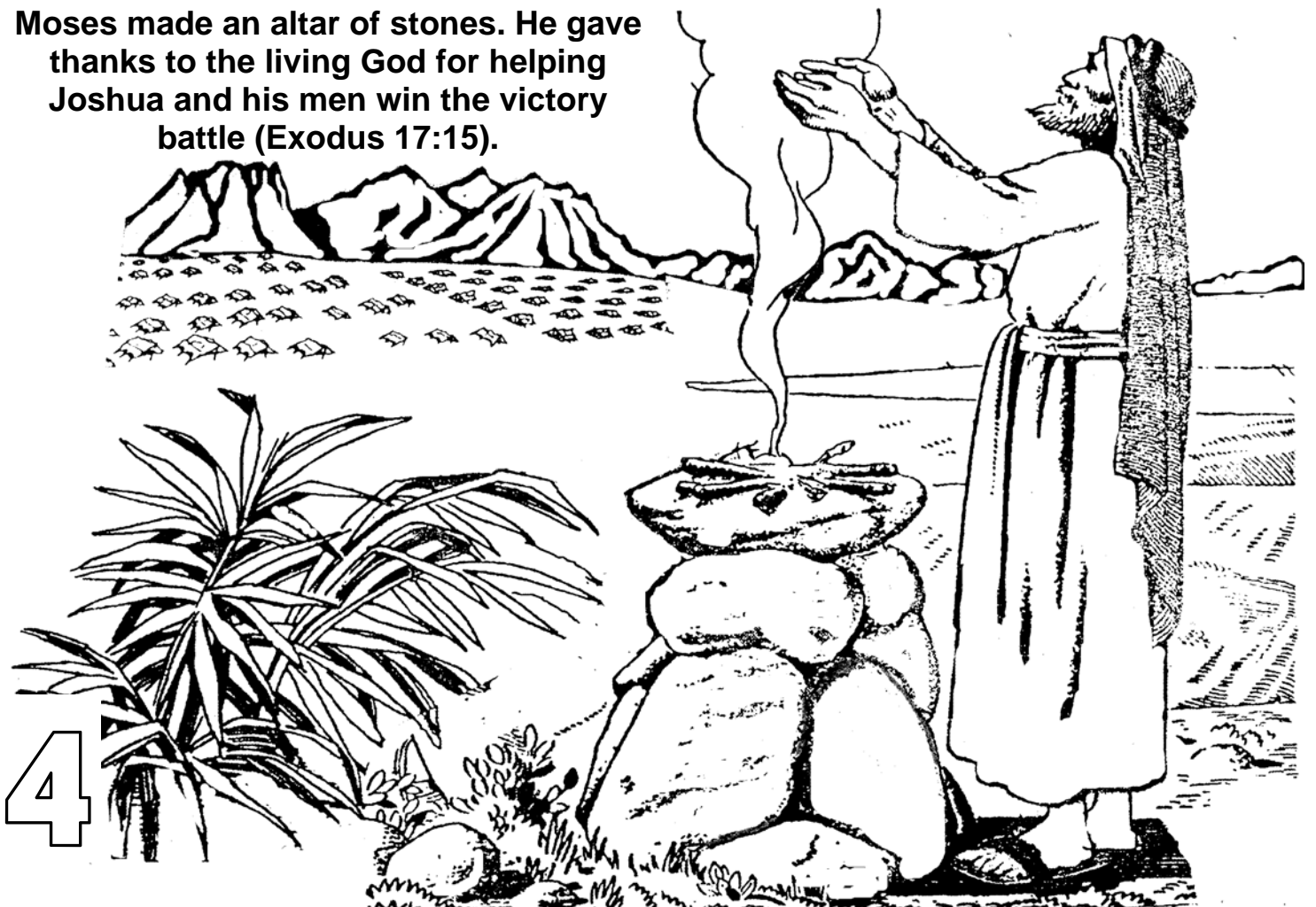

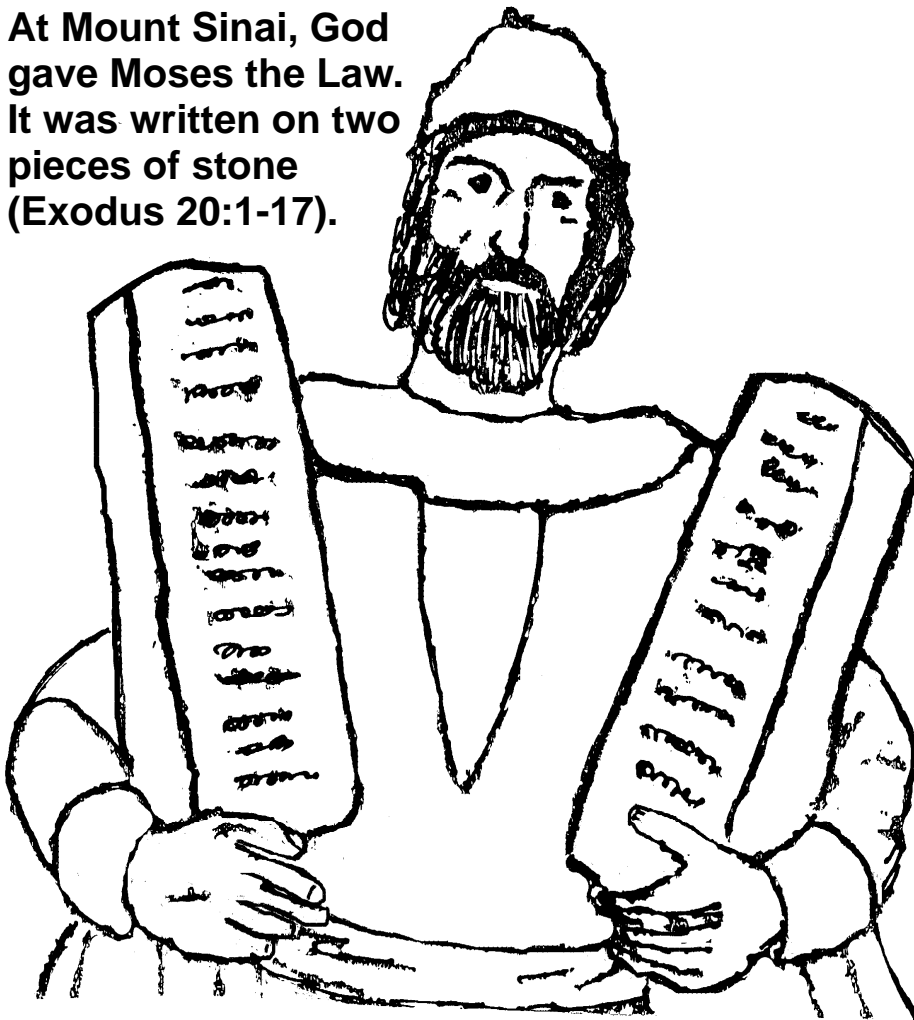
**Moses made an altar of stones. He gave thanks to the living God for helping Joshua and his men win the victory battle (Exodus 17:15).**

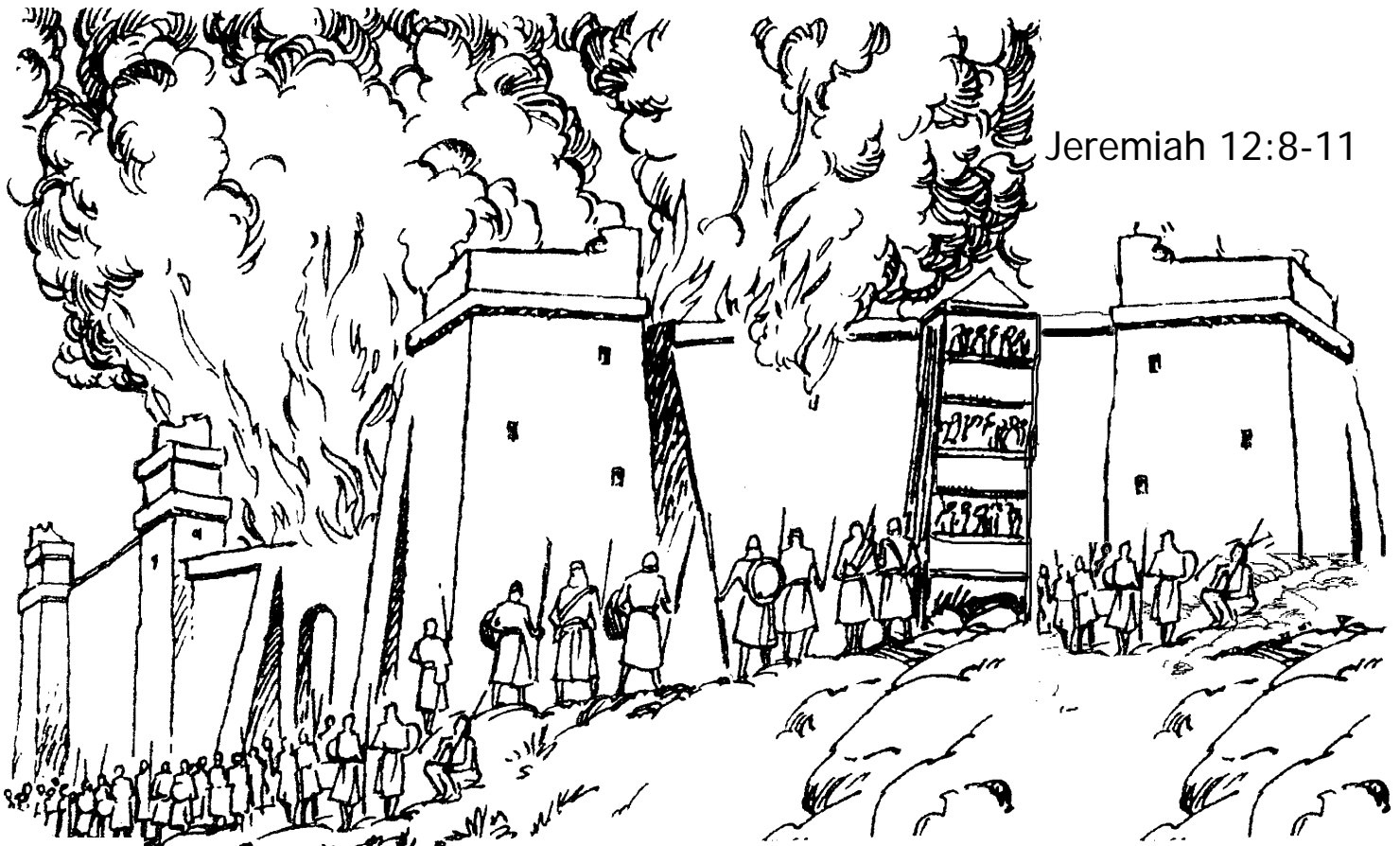

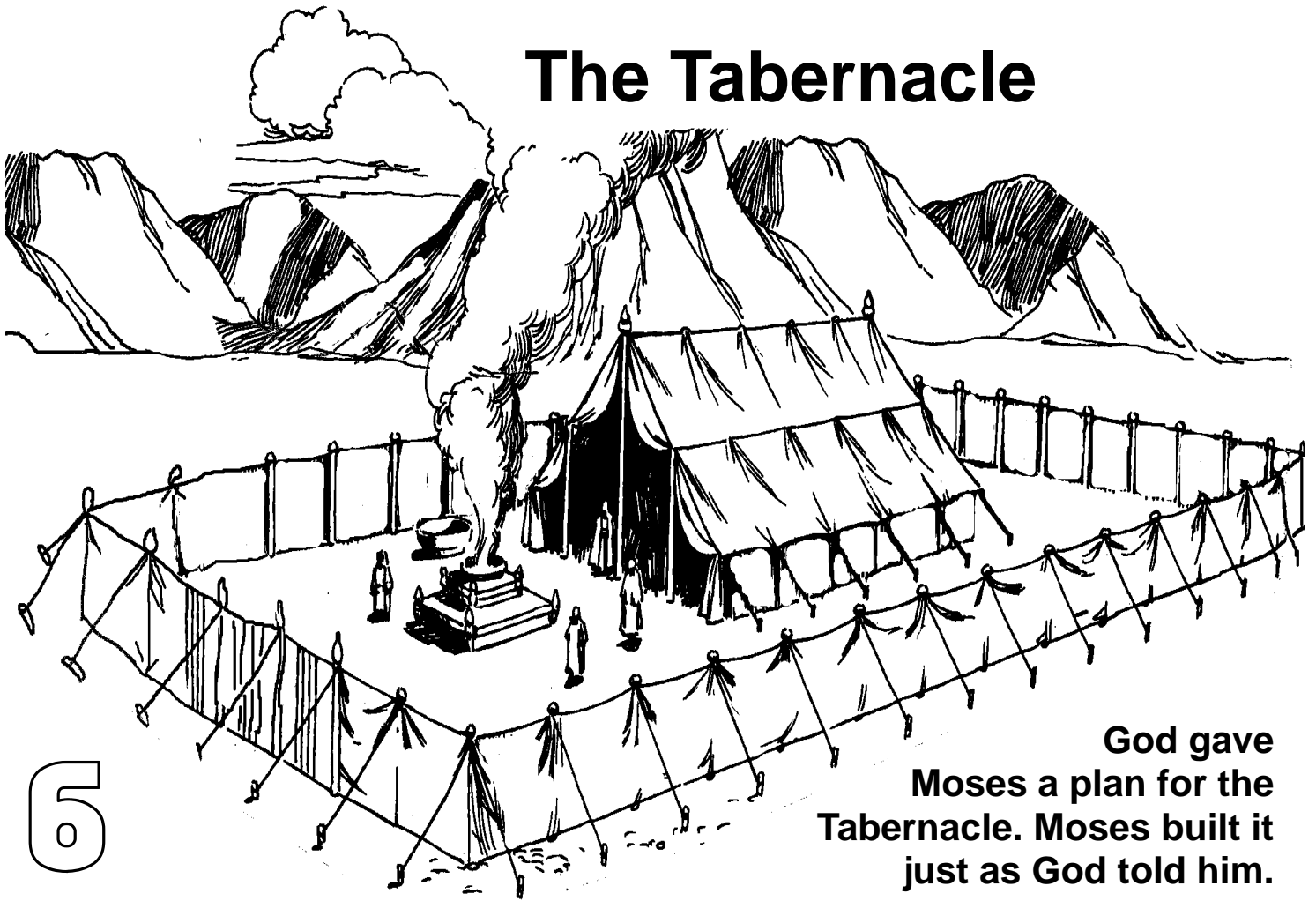

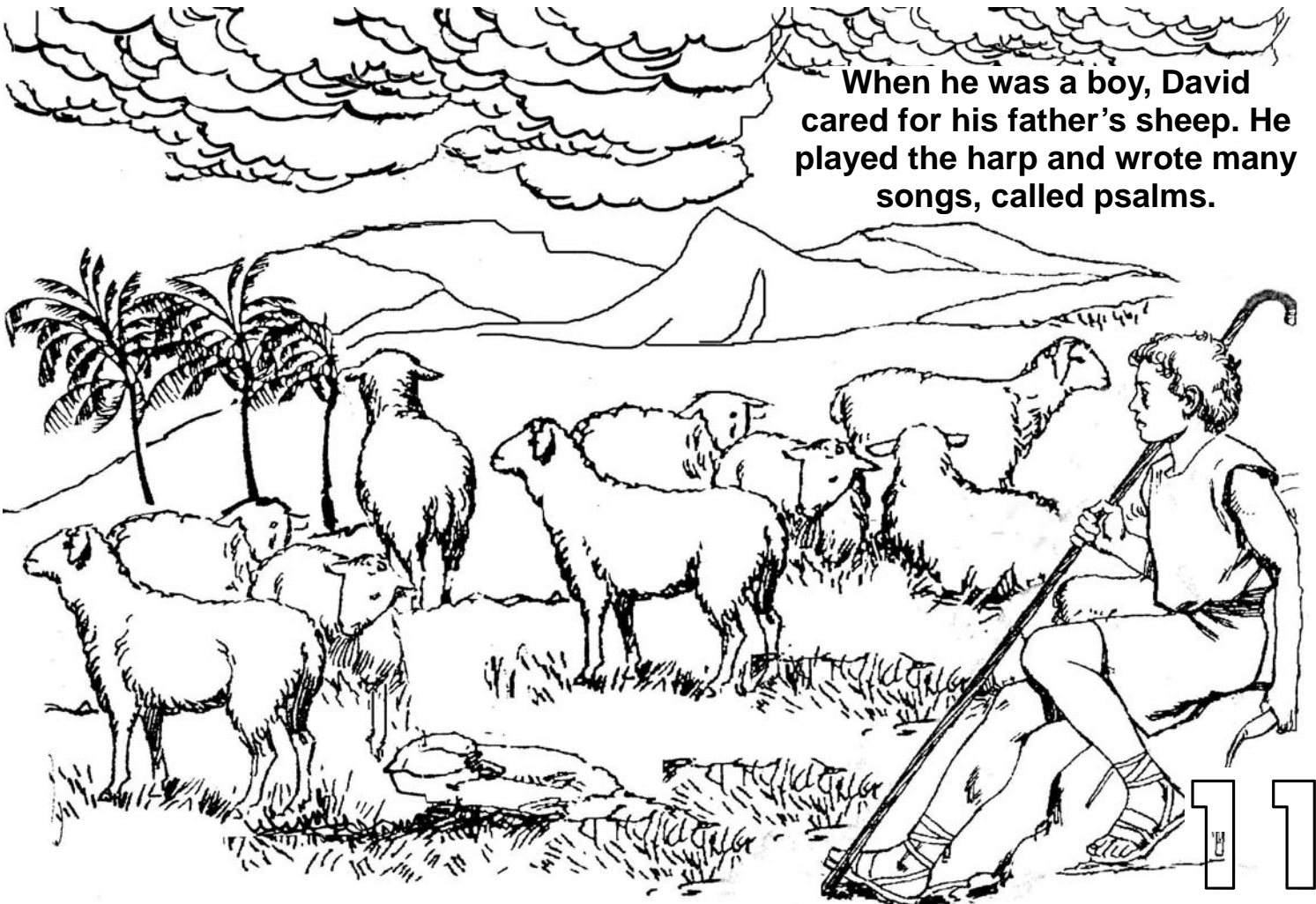

# The Tabernacle

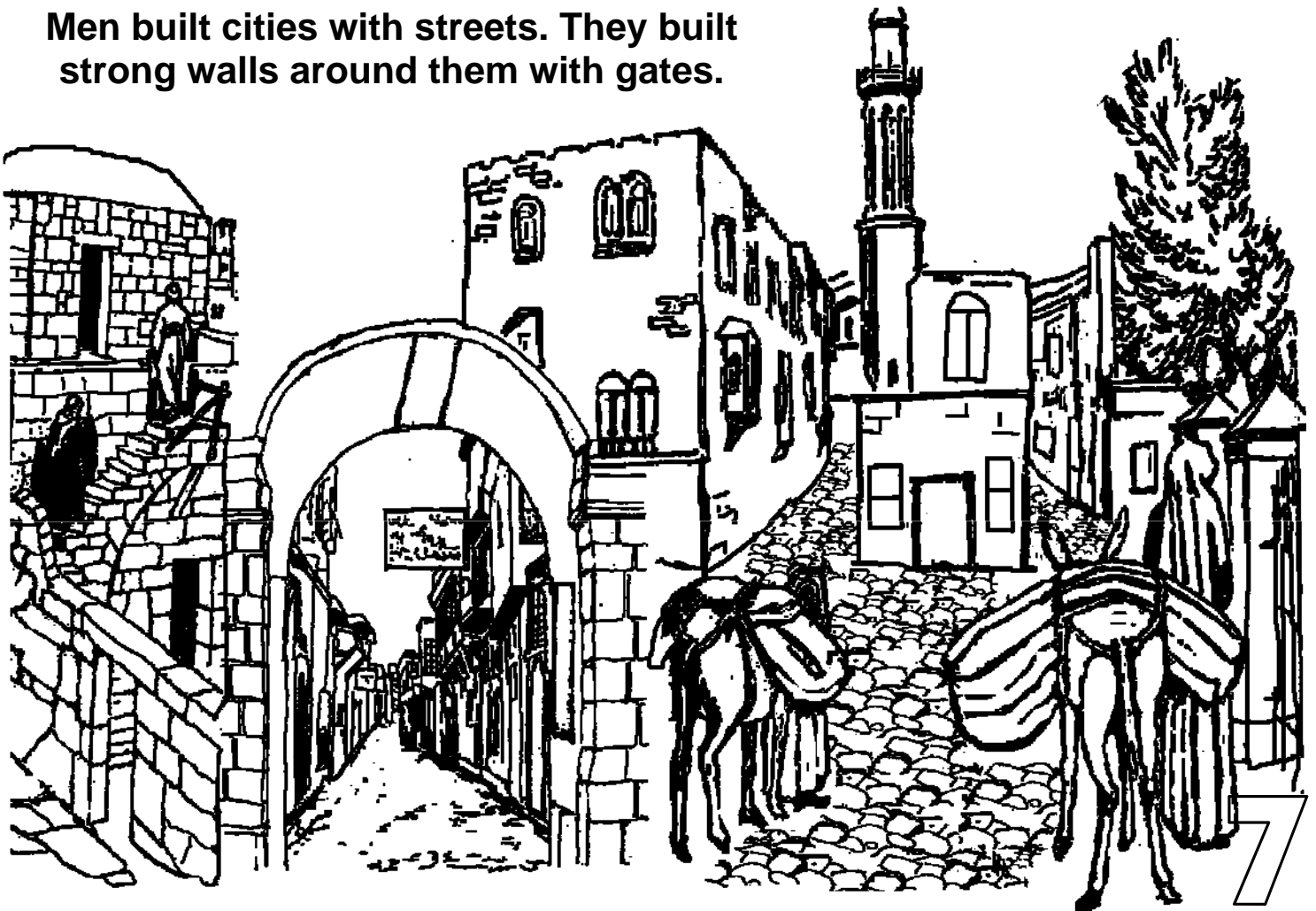


God gave

just as God told him.

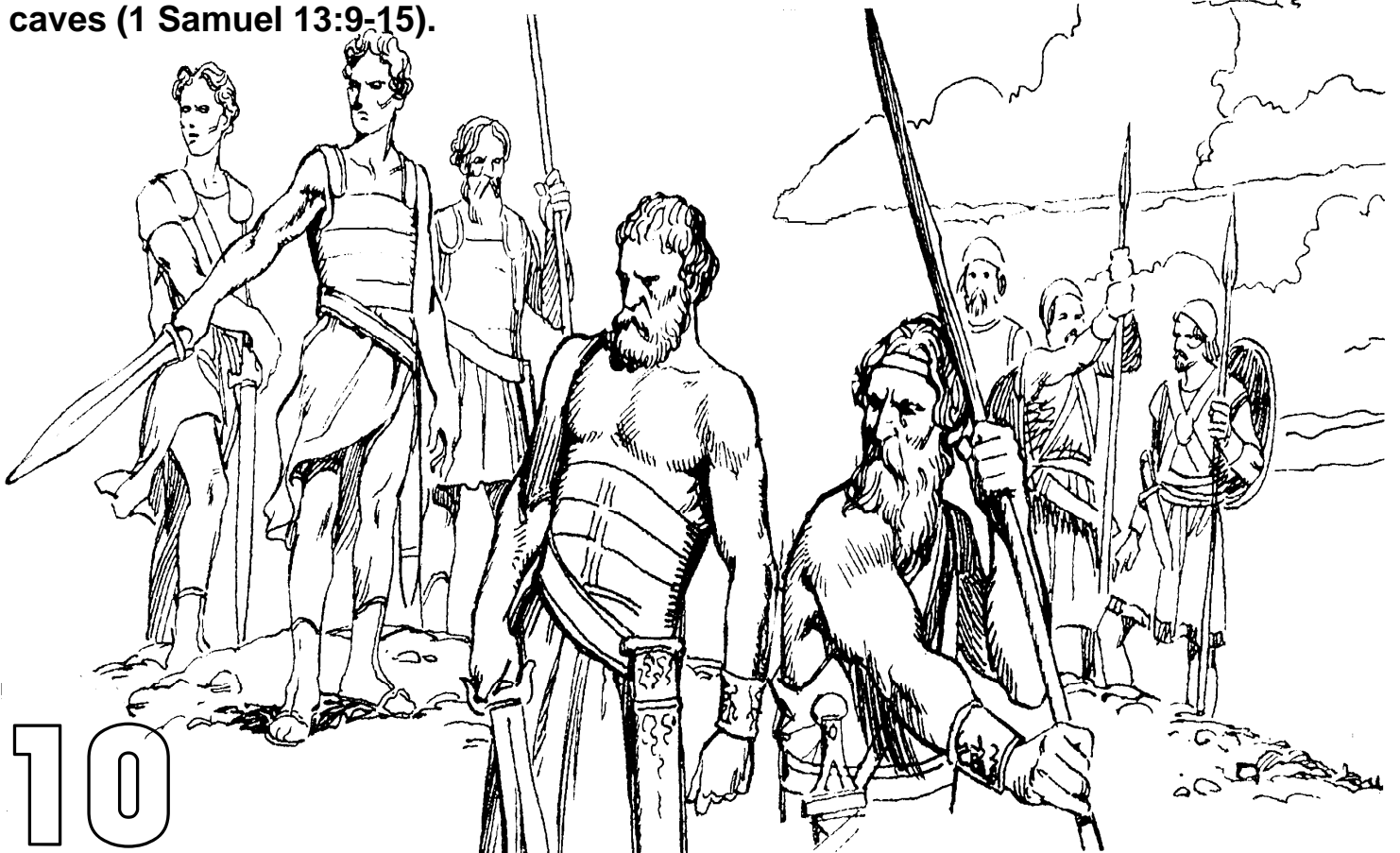


When he was a boy, David

songs, called psalms.

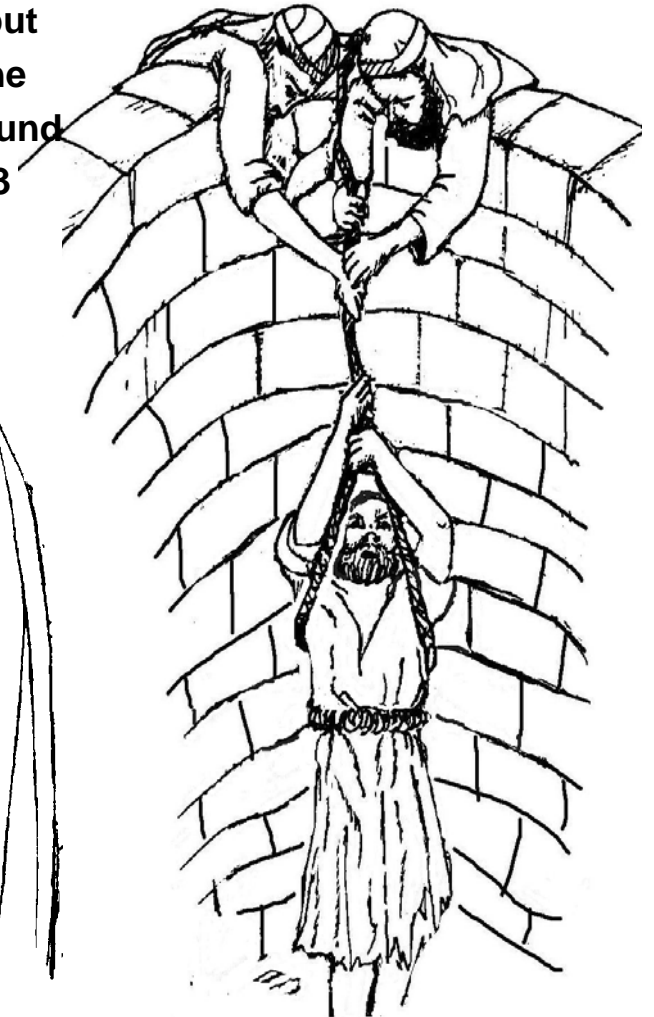
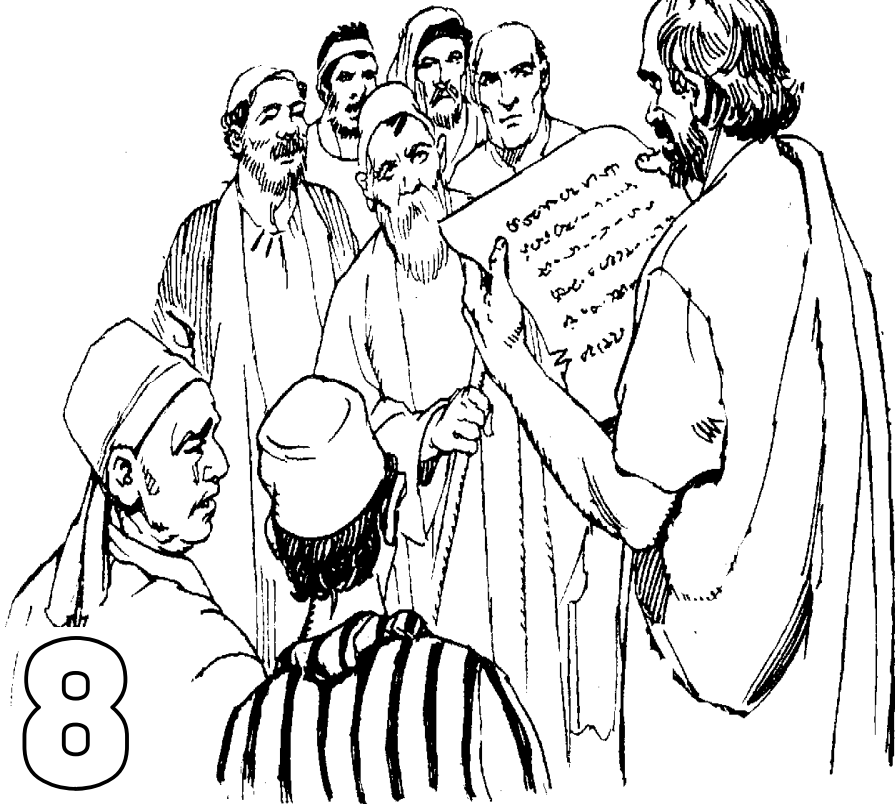
**Men built cities with streets. They built strong walls around them with gates.**
