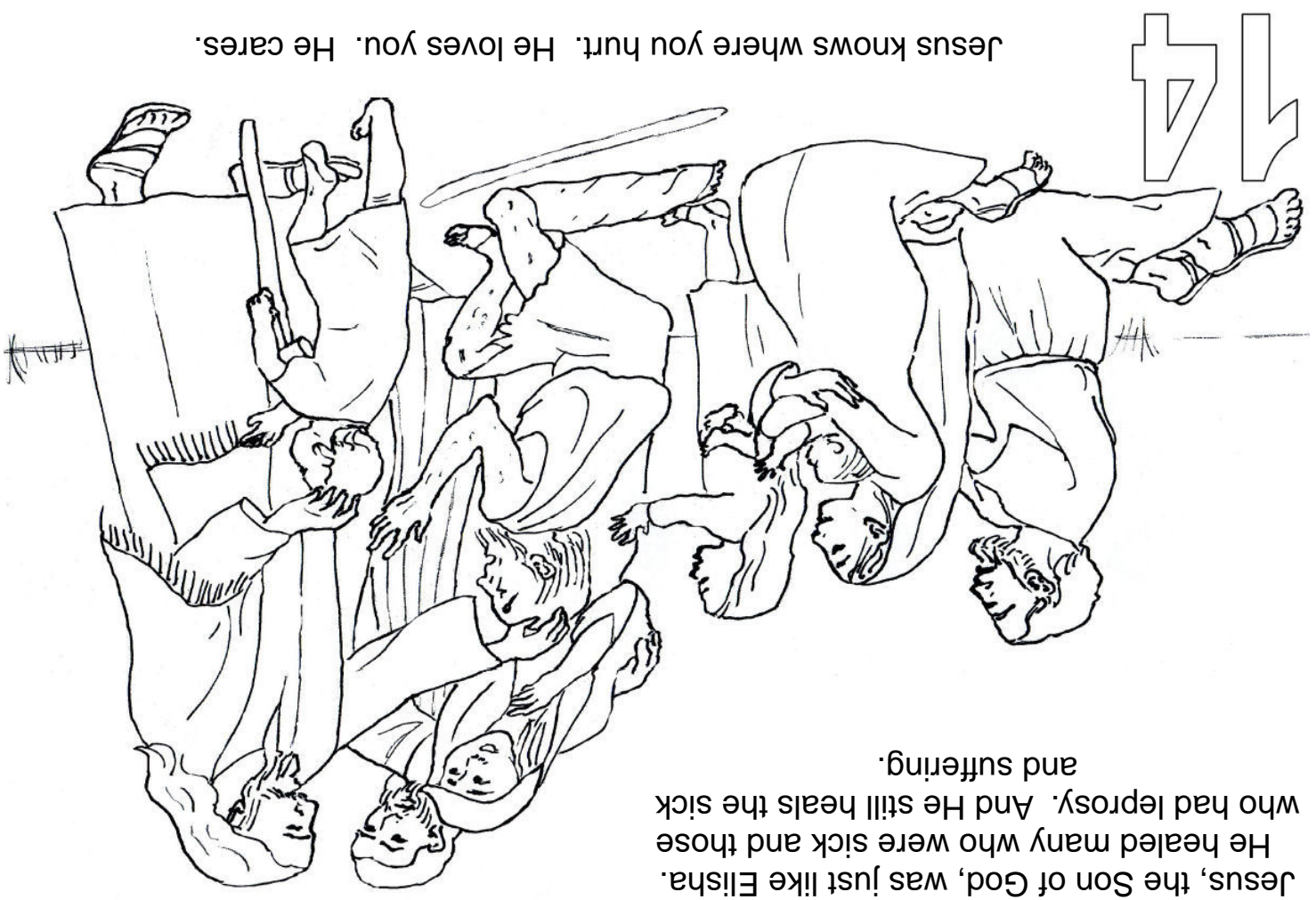

was right. There was a man of God in Israel.

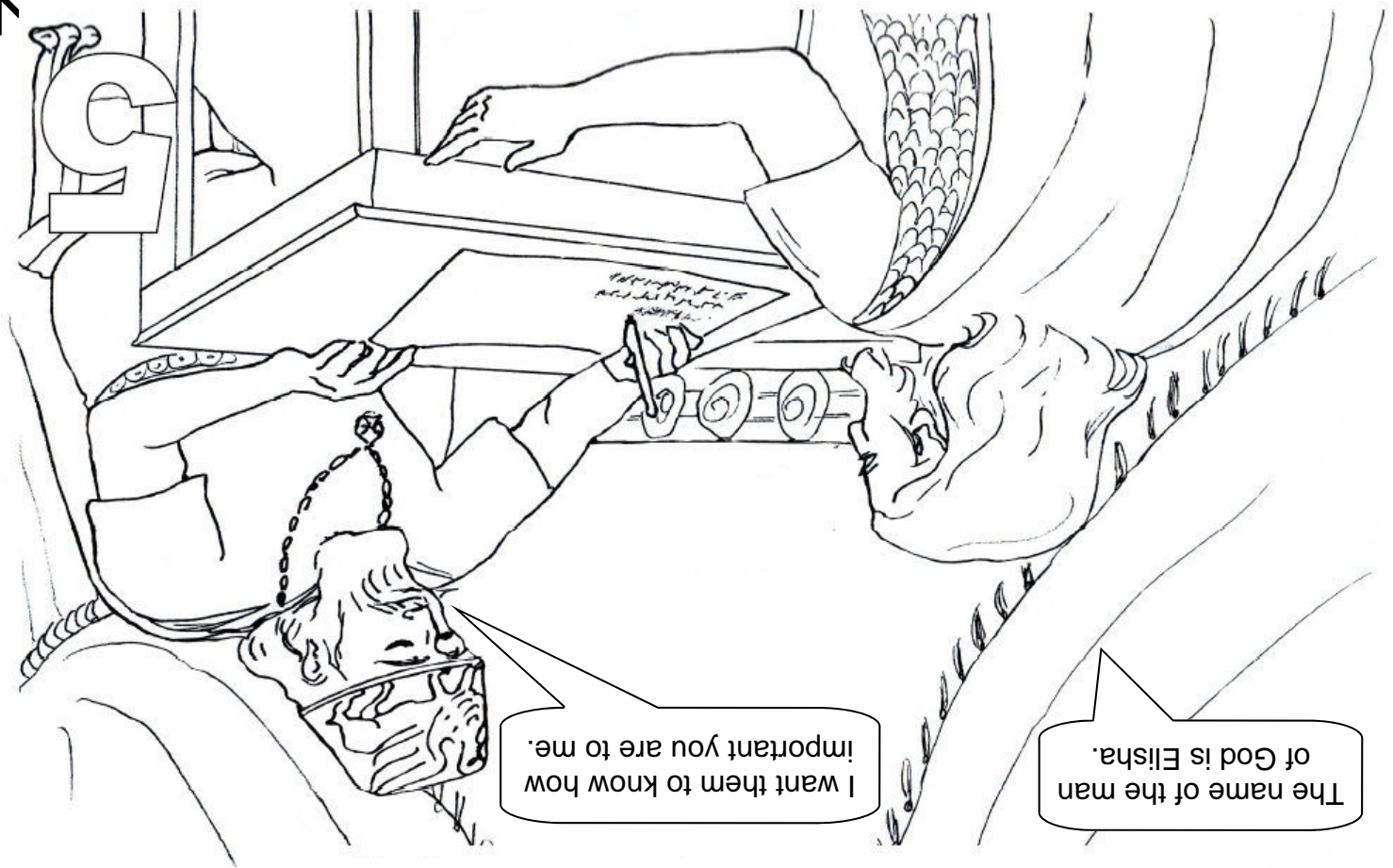
The God of Israel is

Praise the God of Heaven. Let us go and tell the prophet.

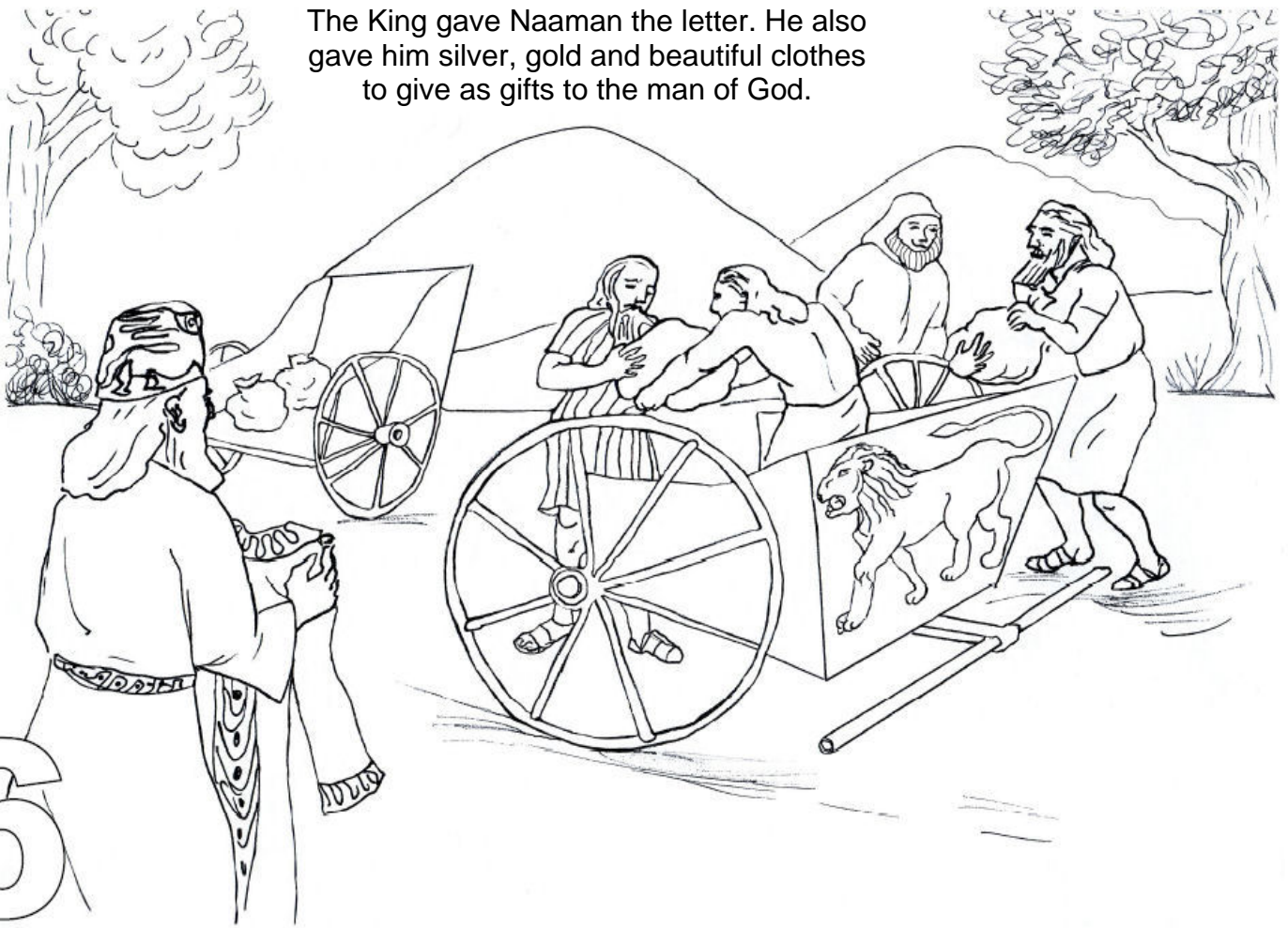
At last I know that the God of Israel is the true God.

The King gave Naaman the letter. He also gave him silver, gold and beautiful clothes to give as gifts to the man of God.

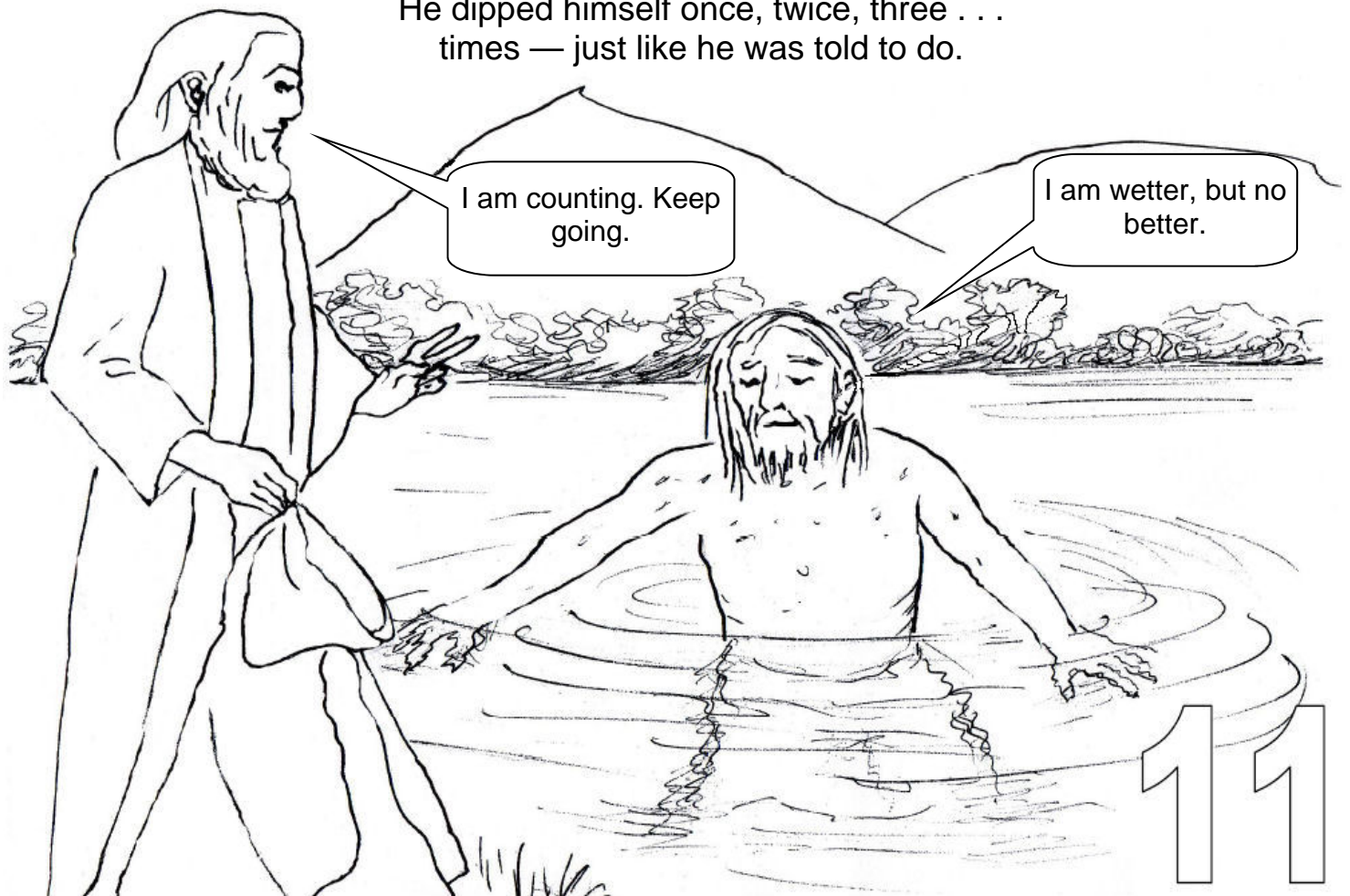

He dipped himself once, twice, three . . . times — just like he was told to do.

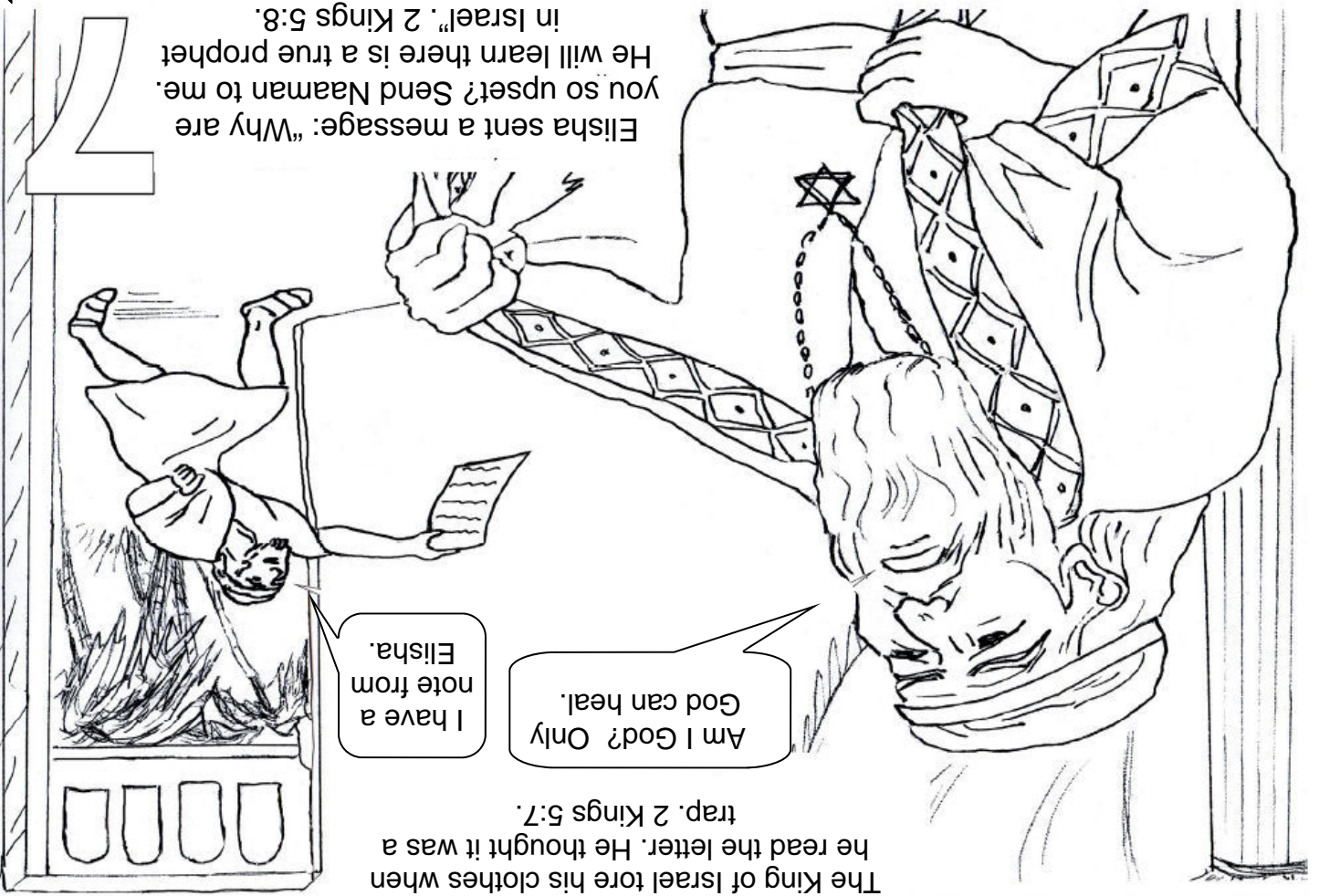
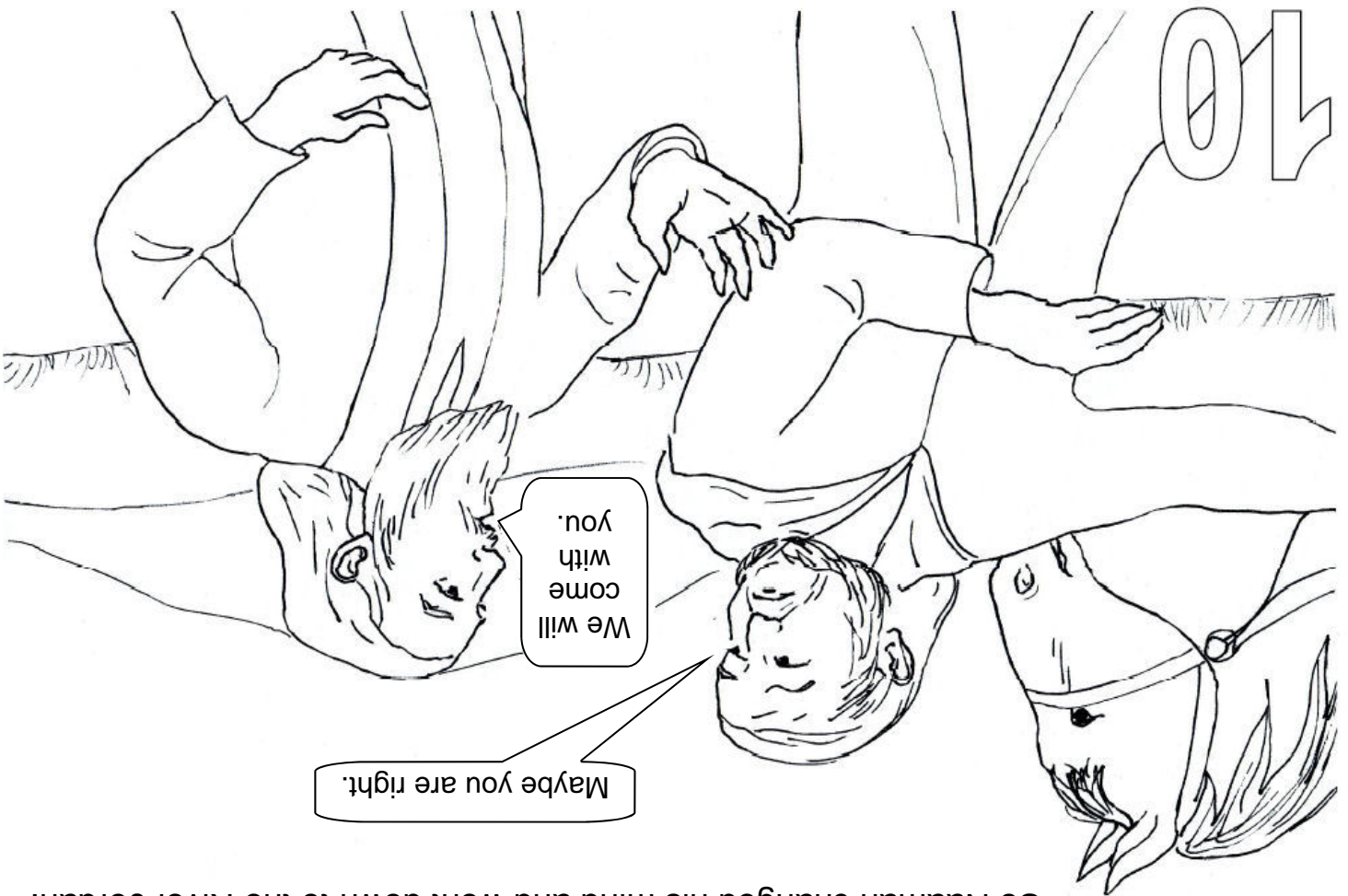

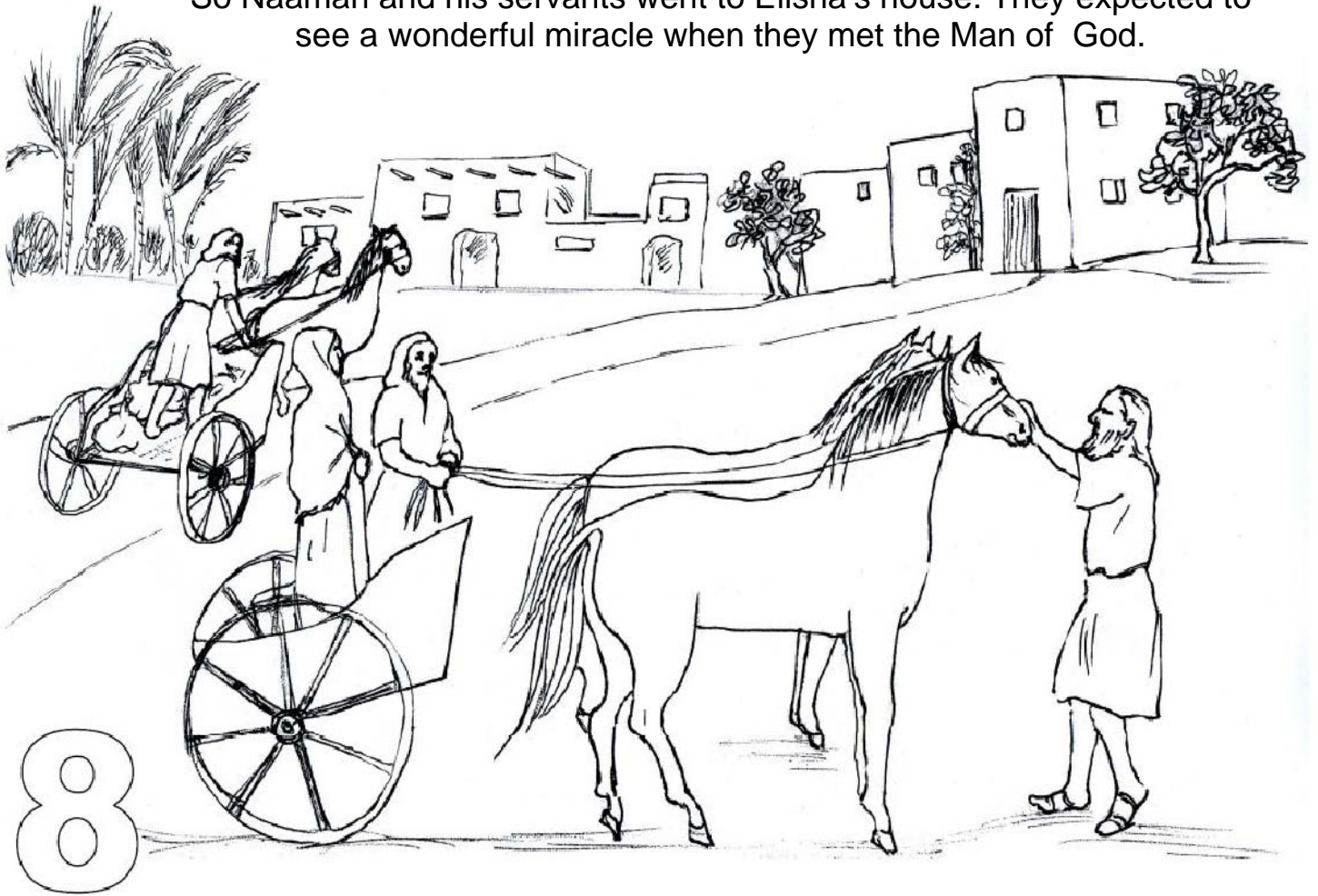
